The 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), the only air assault division in the world, is comprised of



units with storied pasts, whose histories span from untold fabled feats during World War II—including the first Allied Soldiers to set foot onto German-occupied France and the first invasive force to enter Japan in over 2000 years—to vital victories during the most recent conflicts in the Middle Eastern region, and innumerable, indispensable actions against our enemies, along with purposeful, peaceful engagements alongside our allies, all over the world in between.

Activated August 16, 1942, at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, the 101st Airborne Division was born into the throes of WWII, and since its inception, the division has continually developed its air mobility combat operations. The 101st is recognized for its unmatched air assault capability, is revered for its ability to execute any combat or contingency mission anywhere in the world, and is often called upon to fulfill its next "rendezvous with destiny."

The oldest unit of the modern 1st Brigade Combat Team was first comprised of elements that had existed since 1917 and was activated in 1942 as a charter member of the division as 1st Brigade, 327th Infantry Glider Regiment, 101st Airborne Division. The unit participated in several definitive campaigns of World War II and was then inactivated in 1945. After various reactivations and redesignations, the 1st Brigade, 327th Airborne Infantry Regiment became the first unit from the 101st Airborne Division to deploy to Vietnam in 1964, participated in of 40 combat missions, and redeployed with the division in 1972. The 327th participated in Operation Desert Storm in 1991 and concluded the century with numerous peacekeeping missions around the world.

Since 2003, the 1st Brigade Combat Team has conducted multiple deployments across the Middle East in support of the many operations across the region. During 2016 and 2017 the 1st BCT deployed to Africa to assist U.S. partners in building ready forces, strengthening our partnerships on the continent within the countries of Cameroon, Niger, Malawi, South Africa, Ghana, Gabon, Djibouti, Somalia, Uganda, Senegal, and Rwanda. The Bastogne Brigade's long and decorated history serves as a reminder of the countless Bastogne Soldiers who have given their lives in defense of democracy and freedom around the world. More recently, in 2019 elements of 1st BCT deployed to Iraq and Syria in support of the Combined Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve mission.

The 2nd Brigade's proud

heritage can be traced to Headquarters, 159th Infantry Brigade, an element of the 80th Division in 1917 that was inactivated at the end World War I. Activated in 1941 as the 502nd, a parachute infantry battalion, the unit joined the 101st Airborne Division in 1942, becoming the division's first organic parachute infantry regiment.

The 502nd distinguished itself during many significant battles during World War II. In 1967, the unit deployed to Vietnam and participated in 12 major campaigns. The 502nd participated in Operation Desert

Shield and Operation Desert storm in the early 1990's, and returned to Iraq in 2003 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Since its transformation from an infantry brigade to a modular Brigade Combat Team (BCT) in 2003, the 2nd BCT has deployed multiple times across the Middle East in support of the many operations conducted across the region. In 2018, units from the 2nd Brigade Combat Team deployed across Africa as part of a Regionally Aligned Forces mission.

The 3rd Brigade Combat Team draws its lineage from the 187th Infantry Regiment, constituted in 1942 at Camp Mackall, North Carolina, and designated as a Glider Infantry Regiment. The 187th deployed to the Pacific theater in mid-1944 and at the conclusion of WWII, the 187th was selected to spearhead the occupation of Japan, momentously becoming the first force of opposition to enter Japan in more than 2,000 years.

In 1950, the recently reorganized and redesignated 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team deployed to Korea, where its successes convinced the Pentagon to reactivate the XVIII Airborne Corps at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. The 187th was reconfigured as the 3rd Brigade of the 101st Airborne Division in 1964, and in 1967, the 3rd Brigade reported for duty in the Republic of Vietnam, conducting innumerable operations throughout every Corps area in the Vietnam theater.

In 1990, the 3rd Brigade deployed for Operation Desert Shield, and in 2001, deployed to Afghanistan, becoming the first Army brigade deployed in support of the Global War on Terrorism. Since then, the 3rd BCT has deployed many more times to the Middle East in support of multiple operations. In 2019, elements of the 3rd BCT deployed to the African continent in support of U.S Africa Command operations, while other elements deployed to the southwestern border of the United States to assist Department of Homeland Security with logistical, engineering, and force



protection functions in support of Operation Faithful Patriot.

Originally formed as the 176th Field Artillery Brigade in 1921, the 101st Airborne Division Artillery (DIVARTY) has served as a part of the 101st Airborne Division since the division's activation in 1942. The 101st DIVARTY participated in numerous campaigns during World War I, and it was the DIVARTY commander and acting division commander, Brig. Gen. Anthony McAuliffe, who refused the German demand for surrender at Bastogne with his now legendary answer—"Nuts!" Following inactivation in 1945, 101st DIVARTY was reactivated in 1965. Deployed in support of combat operations in the Republic of Vietnam from 1965 through 1971, the division artillery participated in 12 campaigns in Vietnam. Since 2003, DIVARTY has deployed many times in support of the division's multiple operations across the Middle Eastern region, reliably coordinating, synchronizing, and integrating fires for the division. In 2018, 101st DIVARTY deployed headquarters elements and radar to Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan in support of Operations Resolute Support and Freedom's Sentinel.

The 101st Airborne Division Sustainment Brigade was activated July 1, 1956, at Fort Campbell as the 101st Airborne Division Support Group, with the mission of providing supply support, field maintenance, medical support, and a host of miscellaneous services for all of the division's assigned and attached elements. In 1966, the Sustainment Brigade deployed to South Vietnam to provide the division with critical support during 12 of the conflict's 17 campaigns. In 1990, the Lifeliners deployed in support of Operation Desert Storm, performing the critical task of establishing a helicopter rearm and refuel point. In 2001, Lifeliners deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, and the brigade has since deployed numerous times to the Middle East in support of the Global War on Terrorism's many campaigns-most recently, Lifeliners deployed to Kuwait in 2019 in support of Operation Spartan Shield and Operation Inherent Resolve, providing uninterrupted transportation of supplies and equipment throughout Kuwait in support of U.S. forces.

In 2014, three battalions of the 101st Sustainment Brigade provided logistical support to the U.S. Agency for International Development-led comprehensive U.S. government response to the Ebola pandemic in West Africa, known as Operation United Assistance. More recently, in 2020, Lifeliners deployed to the northeastern United States, in New York and Boston, to provide logistical and medical support to the COVID-19 pandemic response.

The 101st Aviation Brigade was initially constituted as the 4th Aviation Section (Light) on Dec. 7, 1950, under the Eighth U.S. Army Korea. The unit saw several activations and deactivations over the next several years. In 1968, the brigade was constituted as the 160th Aviation Group while serving in Vietnam. In 1969, the 160th was redesignated as the 101st Aviation Group. With air mobility added to the capabilities of the 101st Airborne Division, the helicopter became the Screaming Eagles' primary mode of transportation to the battlefield. In 1986, the 101st Aviation Group was redesignated as the Aviation Brigade, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault).

In 1990, the Aviation Brigade deployed to Saudi Arabia following Iraq's invasion of Kuwait. During the ensuing years, the brigade deployed forces to Somalia, Kuwait, Bosnia, Kosovo, and Honduras to defend democracy and assist in recovery from natural disasters. In 1997, the 101st Aviation Brigade split nine battalions into two brigades: the 101st Aviation Brigade (Attack) and the 159th Aviation Brigade (Assault).

In 2002, the 101st Aviation Brigade deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, and since then, it has provided full-spectrum aviation support to coalition forces during every



major operation in the Middle Eastern region. Recently, the 101st CAB deployed to Afghanistan in 2018, providing aviation support to the entire Combined Joint Operational Area-Afghanistan in support of the NATO-led Resolute Support mission and U.S. Forces-Afghanistan. Most recently, in 2020, elements of the 101st CAB conducted a rotational deployment to South Korea, while other elements of the brigade deployed to Europe to participate in Atlantic Resolve in support of the United States' NATO allies and partners. The 101st Combat Aviation Brigade is continually at

the forefront of Army aviation. Honor, duty, and innovation are the hallmarks of the Soldiers who continue the proud tradition of the Wings of Destiny.



The 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) draws its lineage from the 1st Spe-

cial Service Force, a combined Canadian-American regiment activated in July 1942. During WWII, the unit fought in the Italian Campaign and in southern France before being inactivated in 1945. In 1960, the 5th Special Forces Group (SFG) was constituted in the Regular Army as 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces, and activated at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in 1961.

In 1962, the 5th SFG began serving tours of duty in South Vietnam, and by 1965, all of the group were deployed and dispersed to 270 locations throughout South Vietnam. Although the 5th SFG officially returned to Fort Bragg in 1971, members of the group continued to conduct intelligence operations in Southeast Asia until 1975. On June 16, 1988, the 5th group colors, adorned with 27 Vietnam campaign streamers, were uncased at Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

In 1990, the 5th Special Forces Group deployed for Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm, conducting foreign internal defense, special reconnaissance, direct action, and combat search and rescue missions in support of every allied contingent among the coalition. In October 2001, the 5th SFG was one of the first American units deployed to Afghanistan for Operation Enduring Freedom, and since then, the group has conducted a full array of Special Forces missions across the CENTCOM area of responsibility, while also providing training and support to our partners around the globe.

Following its reactivation in 1993 at Fort Gillem, Georgia, the group relocated to Fort Campbell in June 2009.

After the onset of the Global War on Terrorism, the 52nd Ordnance Group (EOD) conducted myriad deployments in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom, while providing force protection and training to United States forces and our allies worldwide. Most recently in 2018 and 2019, elements of the 52nd Ordnance Group (EOD) conducted multiple deployments across all U.S. Central Command areas, including Iraq, Afghanistan, and Syria, in support of Operation Inherent Resolve, Operation Freedom's Sentinel and Operation Spartan Shield, providing force-protection response against everything from improvised explosive devices to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear hazards.

THE SABALAUSKI AIR ASSAULT SCHOOL

Mobile Badge" was developed by Brig. Gen. Harry W. O. Kinnard and first issued in 1964. In order to qualify for this badge, each Soldier had to successfully rappel from a helicopter, three times from 60 feet and twice from 120 feet. Each Soldier had to pass aircraft safety procedures, aircraft orientation, hand and arm signals, combat assault operations, prepare, inspect and rig equipment for a sling load, and be able to secure equipment carried in cargo helicopters.

On Feb. 1, 1974, Maj. Gen. Sidney B. Berry established what is now known as the Air Assault School. The training requirements



were based off the original "Air Mobile Badge." At the time, the school was five days long, and at its completion, Soldiers were awarded the Air Mobile Badge. The Air Mobile Badge was later renamed the Air Assault Badge, which followed in the tradition of the Glider and Airborne Badges that were worn proudly by the 101st Division Soldiers.

In 1994, the Air Assault School was renamed in honor of retired Command Sgt. Maj. Walter J. Sabalauski. Since it was established, the school has graduated more than 200,000 U.S. and foreign military personnel. The school is designed to train Soldiers in all facets of air assault operations unique to the world's only Air Assault Division.

The Sabalauski Air Assault School is also responsible for the Pathfinder Course, Rappel Master Course, FRIES/SPIES Master Course and the Division Pre-Ranger Course.



Soldiers must meet all requirements listed on the Fort Campbell Form 4137 prior to arrival. Off post and TDY students can check the school's webpage on Fort Campbell's public website, www.campbell.army.mil, or call directly for further information.

531ST HOSPITAL CENTER "TO PRESERVE LIFE"

ter is a diverse organization of medical experts that provide advanced care to the 101st Airborne Division and other Army elements. The 531st Hospital Center was activated in April 2018 as part of Army Medicine's modernized, modular update to combat support hospitals. Its subordinate units include the 586th Field Hospital, 175th Surgical Detachment, 41st Medical Detachment, 431st Intermediate Care Ward Detachment, 212th Combat Operation Stress Control (COSC), 772nd Forward Resuscitative Surgical Team (FRST), 179th Medical Detachment (Optometry), 72nd Medical Detachment Veterinary Service Support, 501st Medical Company Area Support (MCAS) and 61st Medical Detachment (Preventive Medicine). The team provides services such as intensive and intermediate medical care, surgery, dental and pharmacy, laboratory services, and others.

In October 2019, 531st HC and subordinate units conducted an Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercise, which tests Army units with a short-notice deployment under emergency conditions. With less than a week's notice, more than 300 Soldiers deployed to provide Role III

support to the 3rd Cavalry Regiment from Fort Hood, Texas during their rotation to the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, Calif. The 531st's successful completion of this mission, was a significant precursor to their next major mission.

In March 2020, with less than a week's notice, 531st HC along with the 586th Field Hospital and its subordinate detachments – 431st, 175th and 41st Medical Detachments – deployed to New York City in support of medical operations in COVID-19 affected areas. During their two-month deployment, the 531st set up a temporary hospital to help care for COVID-19 patients.




The current hospital was officially dedicated on Sept. 17, 1982, in remembrance of Col. Florence A. Blanchfield, Chief of the Army Nurse Corps from 1943-1947. Col. Blanchfield played a prominent role in World War II by placing nursing teams close to the front lines to provide expert nursing care to battlefield casualties and was instrumental in attaining permanent commissioned officer status for military nurses. Blanchfield Army Community Hospital is unique in the U.S. Army Medical Department as the only hospital named after an Army Nurse Corps officer. Col. Florence Blanchfield was the first woman to receive a regular Army Commission.

HOW TO GET TO FORT CAMPBELL

Upon arrival to Fort Campbell, report to the 1st Lt. J. Robert Kalsu Replacement Company, at Building 6916 on the corner of Desert Storm Avenue and 34th Street, with the following: leave form, PCS orders, personnel file, and medical and dental records. If signing in between 6 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, you must be dressed in the Army Combat Uniform or Army Service Uniform. (Kalsu Replacement Company is open 24/7.) If arriving at Nashville International Airport, you will be responsible for transportation from the airport to Fort Campbell. An airport shuttle will cost approximately \$70 to take you from the airport to Fort Campbell. Lodging at the Kalsu Replacement Company is for single Soldiers private (E-1) through sergeant (E-5). If you are married and your spouse or family does not accompany you, you can receive a room for the duration of in-processing. All other Soldiers requiring temporary lodging must report to the Holiday Inn Express, 82 Texas Ave., Fort Campbell, KY 42223. Maps are provided to orient you to the facilities you will visit during your in-processing.

Reservations can be made by calling 877-711-TEAM (8326). Lodging at any other facility is not authorized unless you obtain a certificate of non-availability from Holiday Inn Express. If you encounter any problems en route to Fort Campbell, contact the 1st Lt. J. Robert Kalsu Replacement staff duty desk at 270-798-2817/2813 (24/7).

Driving From Nashville Airport:

- At airport, head south on Terminal Drive
- Go straight toward Arriving Flights/Departing Flights (1 mile)
- Merge onto I-40 west toward Nashville I-65/I-24 (5.5 miles)

- Keep right to take I-24 west via Exit 211B toward Clarksville
- I-65 north and Louisville (4.8 miles)
- Keep left to take I-24 west via Exit 88B toward Clarksville (43 miles)
- Take Exit 1 to Fort Campbell. At the light, take a left onto Trenton Road (0.25 mile)
- On Trenton, at the first light, turn right onto Tiny Town Road (0.5 mile)
- Follow Tiny Town Road to Fort Campbell Boulevard (41A) (7 miles)
- Turn right. Fort Campbell is on the left. At the third light, turn left to enter at Gate 4 (1.5 miles)
- If you miss Exit 1 and enter into Kentucky, take Exit 86 and follow signs to Fort Campbell. Upon entering Fort Campbell Boulevard (41A), Fort Campbell will be on the right side of the road. Go straight ahead and you'll arrive at Gate 4 in approximately 7 miles.

Driving From South of Nashville:

- Take I-65 north toward Nashville
- Follow signs to merge onto Interstate 24 toward Clarksville (43 miles)
- Take Exit 1 to Fort Campbell (follow directions above)

TOTAL ARMY SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

All Soldiers who arrive at Fort Campbell report to the Kalsu Replacement Company for in-processing. During in-processing, Soldiers are met either by their sponsor or a brigade or organization representative. If the Soldier did not receive a sponsor before arrival, that representative will initiate the appointment of a reactionary sponsor. The key to this initial greeting is to create a positive receptive action and to create a good, positive first impression to both the Soldier and his or her family. The Total Army Sponsorship Program team continually works with commanders to ensure 100 percent of all Soldiers receive a sponsor prior to or immediately after arrival at Fort Campbell.

All in-processing Soldiers attend a newcomer's orientation at Cole Park Commons each Thursday and are encouraged to bring their spouses. This orientation provides a wealth of information from support agencies as well as welcoming remarks by the senior commander/command sergeant major and garrison commander/command sergeant major.

6 a.m. and 5 p.m. must be dressed in the Army Combat Uniform or Army Service Uniform. Replacement company cadre will coordinate in-processing, and billeting will be provided for single Soldiers below the rank of sergeant. Soldiers accompanied by their families and Soldiers above the rank of sergeant are authorized billeting at the Holiday Inn Express on a space available basis. All Soldiers must report by the through date on their leave forms. If you are authorized permissive TDY, you may sign into Kalsu on the day your leave terminates.

Each unit's Army Barracks Management Program (ABMP) office is responsible for assigning and terminating service members to their unit's UPH footprint. Unaccompanied Soldiers married to another service member on separate tours, not geographically Co-Located will be assigned to UPH / Barracks on the same basis as unmarried personnel and are not authorized BAH (Basic Housing Allowance). All exceptions to this policy must come from the garrison commander.

Before a Soldier can enter into a lease agreement off post, you must have an approved certificate of non-availability (CNA). You must confirm that you are authorized to receive BAH at the withoutdependent rate before securing a lease off post if you are private (E-1) through sergeant (E-5). Service members who are geographically separated from their families are not authorized to live in UPH. Single Staff Sergeant's (E-6) and above without dependents are authorized to receive BAH at the without-dependent rate and are authorized to live off post. Soldiers in this category are not required to apply for a certificate of non-availability.

Special Education

Special Education Services are available for children ages 3 to 21 years who are identified as having an educational disability or developmental delay. To receive these services, a child must be assessed by a multidisciplinary team, which will include special educators and the child's parents. This team is known as the Case Study Committee (CSC).

Related services, such as speech and language services, occupational therapy services, or physical therapy services are also available based on individual needs as determined by the CSC.

After eligibility for special education is affirmed by the CSC, an Individual Educational Program (IEP) is developed by the team. This document includes goals and objectives appropriate for the child to learn. At this time, service providers will also set both learning objectives and the required weekly time commitment; both will be included in the IEP document.

Special education locations are individually determined by the CSC. This decision is made based upon the nature and severity of the child's educational needs. Families and children served by Educational and Developmental Intervention Services must meet specific eligibility criteria and reside in post housing. Children living off the installation may seek services through Tennessee's Early Intervention or Kentucky First Steps.

SOLDIER HEALTH SERVICES

Army Medicine offers Soldier medical care within the Soldier Centered Medical Home (SCMH). The SCMH mission is to improve and enhance individual and unit medical readiness by using a multi-disciplinary healthcare team approach. This consists of primary care, behavioral health, clinical pharmacy, physical therapy, nutrition care, and nurse case management. This model operates in a proven model of integrated, comprehensive, and proactive care. Other services include audiology, physical exams, laboratory services, radiology and optometry.

electroencephalogram (EEG), immunization, sleep medicine, post-traumatic stress, traumatic brain injury, nuclear medicine, neurology, nutrition care, obstetrics/gynecology, occupational and physical therapy, orthopedic surgery, pathology, preventive medicine, podiatry, radiology and urology.

For more information, contact your primary care provider. Specialty clinics usually require a referral from your primary care provider.

ALLERGY/ASTHMA & PULMONARY FUNCTION TESTING BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-956-0750

Allergy Injections: By appointment and limited walk-in basis only

Patients MUST be a current Allergy Clinic patient to receive allergy injections.

The Allergy Clinic provides specialty care in the evaluation and management of hay fever (allergic rhinitis), asthma, food allergies, chronic hives (urticaria), severe allergic reactions (anaphylaxis), drug allergies, eczema, bee sting allergies, and immune deficiencies. Services provided include skin testing for environmental, food and bee sting allergens, pulmonary function testing, patch testing, and allergy shots (allergen immunotherapy). Patients require a consult from their primary care provider to be seen in the Allergy/Asthma and Pulmonary Clinics.

CARDIOLOGY CLINIC BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-412-8599

The Cardiology Clinic provides expert subspecialty evaluation and management for patients with known or suspected cardiac disease. Services include cardiology evaluations by the cardiologist, stress testing, EKGs and echocardiograms. Patients require a consult from their primary care provider to be seen in the Cardiology Clinic and are asked to schedule appointments in person at the clinic or by calling the clinic office number.

DERMATOLOGY BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-798-8345

The Dermatology Clinic sees active-duty patients who have been referred by their primary care manager for a variety of skin rashes, benign and malignant growths, moles, skin checks, pigmentary abnormalities, cutaneous infections or infestations, and disorders of the hair and nails. The Dermatology Clinic may also see family members and retirees on a space-available basis.

ENT CLINIC – OTOLARYNGOLOGY SERVICES BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-798-8131

The Ear, Nose and Throat Clinic (Otolaryngology services) treats Soldiers, retirees and their family members for diverse problems involving the head and neck. ENT treats ear infections, hearing loss, sinus disease, surgical thyroid and parathyroid disorders, snoring and sleep apnea, difficulty breathing through the nose and nasal deformities, recurrent tonsillitis and lumps in the neck. Patients with these concerns or other problems with the head and neck should see their primary care provider for an ENT referral. After receiving a referral from a health care provider, the patient will be contacted by ENT to schedule an appointment. If the clinic redirects the referral to a TRICARE network provider, the patient will receive a letter in the mail within seven to 10 business days. If no contact has occurred within that time, contact the clinic to verify the status of the referral.

GENERAL SURGERY/ GASTROENTEROLOGY CLINIC Gastroenterology BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-956-0259

The Gastroenterology Clinic treats Soldiers, retirees, and adult family members for a wide array of symptoms involving the gastrointestinal system. Patients have been referred by their primary care manager for intestinal disorders that include diarrhea, abdominal pain, constipation, liver disease, digestive, and swallowing difficulties. The Gastroenterology clinic also cares for patients with inflammatory bowel disease and other complex gastrointestinal disorders. The Gastroenterology Clinic also offers screening for colon cancer and polyps. Patients with the previously mentioned concerns should see their primary care provider for a Gastroenterology referral. After receiving the referral, the patient will be contacted by referral management or the Gastroenterology clinic to schedule an appointment within 3-5 business days. If the clinic directs the referral to a TRICARE network provider, the patient will receive a letter in the mail within 10 business days. If no contact has occurred within that time, contact the primary care provider clinic to verify the status of the referral.

General Surgery BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-798-8407

The General Surgery Clinic treats Soldiers, retirees, and family members range over the age of 4 for a wide array of surgical conditions. The scope of services include, but are not limited to: Gallbladder surgery (laparoscopic and open); hernia repair (ventral, inguinal, laparoscopic, etc.); breast biopsy and mastectomy for cancer and precancerous tumors; fundoplication for Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD); pilonidal cyst procedures; hemorrhoidectomy; gastric sleeve and gastric bypass and lap-bands for morbid obesity (on a limited basis); colon and bowel surgery for colon cancer and benign disease; thyroid procedures; splenectomy; and procedures on the stomach. General Surgery Clinic also treats patients with traumatic injuries, burns, and complex wounds.

Bariatric Surgery is available at Blanchfield through the Bariatric Surgery Program here. Patients must see their primary care provider to obtain a referral to enter the bariatric surgery pathway. Patients who meet specific qualifications for bariatric surgery will be accepted into the program and receive surgery.

All patients with General Surgery concerns should see their primary care provider for a General Surgery referral. After receiving the referral, the patient will be contacted by referral management or the General Surgery Clinic to schedule an appointment within 3-5 business days. If the clinic directs the referral to a TRICARE network provider, the patient will receive a letter in the mail within 10 business days. If no contact has occurred within that time, contact the primary care provider clinic to verify the status of the referral.

INTEGRATED DISABILITY EVALUATION SYSTEM 5980 Desert Storm Ave. 270-461-1563/4768/4320

The Department of Defense and Veterans Affairs worked together to make disability evaluation seamless, simple, fast and fair with the Integrated Disability Evaluation System (IDES). DOD uses the IDES to determine a service member's fitness for duty. If the service member is found medically unfit for duty, the IDES gives them a proposed VA disability rating before they leave the service. The proposed rating informs the service member of the approximate amount of compensation and benefits they will receive from the VA. Through the IDES process, Physical Evaluation Board Liaison Officers (PEBLOs) guide service members through the entire IDES process to ensure they are aware of their options and the many decisions they - or their families - need to make. VA Military Service Coordinators (MSCs) help service members file their VA benefits claim before they leave the service so they can get their benefits as soon as possible after they separate from service.

To make the system fast and fair, there are options available and appeal processes which a service member can choose, to get decisions reviewed along the way. PEBLOs and MSCs guide service members through the entire IDES process to ensure they are counseled on their options. The services will also provide legal counsel at no cost to the service member.

Soldiers MEB Counsel/IDES Legal 6139 Desert Storm Ave. and 42nd Street 270-461-4036/4034/4026

Free legal services are available to Soldiers involved in the Integrated Disability Evaluation System process. The Soldiers' MEB Counsel Team advises and represents Soldiers throughout the IDES process to safeguard their rights and help achieve their desired goals. The Office of Soldiers' Counsel provides accurate and timely advice and ethical and zealous representation to Wounded, III, and Injured Soldiers and Temporary Retirees going through the Army Physical Disability Evaluation System ensuring that clients make informed decisions regarding desired outcomes. The Office of Soldiers' Counsel is the Department of Defense's premier legal advocacy force for Soldiers going through disability processing, ready to protect clients' rights, ensure transparency in the system, and being a positive voice for change.

LABORATORY/ DEPARTMENT OF PATHOLOGY BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-798-8114

The Department of Pathology staff members help ensure Soldier deployment readiness and improve the health and wellness of family members and retirees by providing accurate and timely test results from their full-service clinical laboratory, transfusion service, anatomical pathology, and forensic pathology consultative services. The pathology staff is committed to providing patients and professional medical staff with state-of-the-art laboratory medicine through exceptional customer service while ensuring patient confidentiality and privacy.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY BACH Building A, Fourth Floor Check-in at Room 4AA32 270-798-8085

Occupational Therapy focuses on evaluating, treating and managing patients with upper-extremity neurological and orthopedic injuries. Occupational Therapy provides evidence-based, function-oriented postoperative rehabilitation services following hand/elbow/finger surgery; provides custom fabricated upper extremity orthosis; provides function-based rehab programs for those with various kinds of physical dysfunction; and provides adaptive equipment prescribed to overcome disabilities resulting from injury or surgery. Occupational Therapy uses various thermal and electrical modalities to enable quick return to full function and maximum performance. Patients are typically referred from their physician, PA or nurse practitioner.

OPHTHALMOLOGY CLINIC BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-798-8900

Beneficiaries are referred to the Ophthalmology Service by their primary care manager. Ophthalmologists work to prevent and treat conditions concerning the eye such as glaucoma, cataracts, strabismus and diabetes. After a referral is made by the primary care manager, the ophthalmology



staff will call to schedule the appointment. Follow-up appointments are arranged by calling the clinic. For emergencies, report to the emergency room or your assigned clinic or medical home for initial evaluation. Referrals can be made to the Ophthalmology Clinic as necessary for further care. Please call the clinic at 270-798-8900 to schedule a follow-up appointment.

ORTHOPEDIC CLINIC BACH Building C, Second Floor Front Desk: 270-798-8426

The Orthopedic Clinic's goal is to keep you in the game or get you back in the game! Orthopedics treats patients of all ages and beneficiary status. Orthopedics is a referral specialty, and appointments are made from a consult from the PCM or ER. The scope of services include: Sports medicine injuries; uncomplicated hand surgery; orthopedic trauma; limited pediatric orthopedic surgery; foot and ankle surgery; general orthopedic surgery; and total joint replacement. Services not offered include: Spine surgery, complex pediatric orthopedic surgery and severe multiple trauma orthopedic surgery. The clinic works diligently to provide maximum access to care; however, if service is inaccessible, a great network of local surgeons is available.

PHYSICAL THERAPY BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-798-8102

Byrd Physical Therapy: 270-461-1134

LaPointe Physical Therapy: 270-412-8686

Physical Therapists evaluate, diagnose, and develop treatment plans for patients with orthopedic or sport related injury or dysfunction. They use specific exercise prescription, joint and soft-tissue manual techniques, and other therapeutic interventions to optimize human movement, facilitate healing, and maximize function. Patients are referred to the PT Clinic from their physician, PA or nurse practitioner.

Unit Classes: The Physical Therapy staff educates and promotes health, fitness and injury prevention among the Fort Campbell population. Unit level classes include: Alternative Physical Training – to include dynamic warm-up, mobility drills, plyometrics, core strengthening, speed/agility drills; Unit Leadership Training on Injury Prevention, and Special Population Physical Training and program design. Unit representatives should call 270-412-8686 or 270-798-8102 to schedule classes. For units in 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Brigades, contact your respective brigade physical therapist. For SOCOM units, contact your respective THOR3 facility.

NUTRITION CLINIC: B Building, 1st Floor Front Desk: 270-798-8600

The nutrition clinic offers general wellness counseling, sports nutrition counseling, medical nutrition therapy counseling, and counseling to fulfill Army Body Composition Program (ABCP) requirements in accordance with AR 600-9. For patients with specific disease states that are being followed by primary care or another specialty provider, referrals are preferred. For general wellness, weight loss, and sports nutrition, and ABCP, patients can self-refer by calling 270-798-8600.

Unit Classes: Registered Dietitians are available to provide unit classes outside of the hospital at any unit level. Unit level class topics include: general nutrition, performance nutrition, supplements, eating on a budget, or any other topic of interest. Unit representatives should call 270-798-8600 to schedule classes.

PODIATRY CLINIC

BACH Building C, Second Floor Front Desk: 270-798-8426

Surgery Scheduling Line: 270-798-6655 Located inside the Orthopedic Clinic. Podiatry appointments are made on a referral basis only.

During duty hours, the referring physician will contact the podiatrist for a same day, emergency or 72-hour consult. Other consults will be scheduled as routine. If you have an emergency after duty hours, go to the emergency room. Scope of services: Sports medicine and injuries of the foot; trauma of the foot; limited pediatric foot surgery; and general foot surgery.

RADIOLOGY (WITHIN THE HOSPITAL) BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-798-8333

The Radiology Department provides medical imaging. Routine radiographs are obtained on a walk-in, first-come, firstserved basis. All specialty imaging (CT, MRI, Ultrasound, Bone Density, Nuclear Medicine, and Fluoroscopy) procedures are scheduled over the phone or in person.

Scheduled exams require three days after the order is placed by the provider before they can be scheduled. The three-day period allows radiologists to review, and if needed, clarify order requests to ensure patients are receiving the most appropriate study.

Mammography guidelines: Baseline mammogram is recommended at age 40, followed by annual exam thereafter. For self-referral, the patient must be enrolled in TRICARE Prime, over 40 years of age, and have no current breast health issues.

Otherwise, the patient's provider should place a consult request for a mammogram

and the patient will schedule the appointment in the Mammography Section.

Scope of services: Radiographs, Fluoroscopy, CT, MRI, Ultrasound, Mammography, Bone Density and Nuclear Medicine. Radiology services are provided at the main hospital and two outlying clinics: Byrd and LaPointe Medical Home.

RADIOLOGY AT BYRD SOLDIER AND PATIENT-CENTERED MEDICAL HOME Embedded within Specialist Byrd Troop Medical Clinic, Gate 10 7973 Thunder Blvd.

UROLOGY CLINIC

BACH Building B, Second Floor 270-798-8403

The Urology Clinic is a specialty clinic that generally receives referrals from the beneficiary's primary care manager. Clinic appointments are scheduled on a priority basis. Emergencies and urgent consults are prioritized first as to need. Scope of services: Provide diagnosis and treatment for all aspects of urology to include prevention and screening. These services include urinary incontinence, prostate disease, infertility, pediatrics, kidney stones, impotence, and other disorders of the genitourinary system.

WARFIGHTER REFRACTIVE EYE SURGERY CENTER BACH Building C, Third Floor 270-956-0775

The Warfighter Refractive Eye Surgery Center (WRESC) provides services to active duty service members who are stationed at Fort Campbell and have at least 18 months remaining on active duty from the day of surgery. Combat Arms Soldiers receive first priority. The WRESC performs two types of surgeries, LASIK and PRK (photorefractive keratectomy). Both of these procedures use the same laser to reshape the cornea on the front surface of the eye. If you are interested in receiving refractive eye surgery, you may pick up packets anytime during business hours.

WOMEN'S HEALTH CLINIC (OBGYN) BACH Building A, Third Floor 270-798-8151

The Department of Women's Health includes the Women's Health Clinic (OB/ GYN), Labor and Delivery Unit, Mother-Baby Unit and Special Care Nursery. The Department of Women's Health provides a wide spectrum of health care by obstetrical and gynecological specialty physicians, certified nurse midwives, nurse practitioners, nationally certified obstetrical registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, health technicians and administrative staff.

The Women's Health Clinic provides classes on Breastfeeding, Childbirth Preparation, Infant Care and Daddy Boot Camp. For wellness classes, please see our current schedule.

For these wellness classes, please see our current schedules. We also offer Centering™ in pregnancy; more information is given during the OB orientation appointment.

For non-emergent pregnancy-related issues at any time, please use TOL Secure Messaging at www.TOLsecuremessaging. com to request an appointment. This is the preferred method and you will receive a quick response. If you contact us by phone (270-798-8151) for non-emergent issues, please leave a name and a good phone number for us to call back. It may take up to three business days to respond. We highly recommended patients to sign up for TOL Secure Messaging as a proficient way to communicate with your BACH team.

Gynecological services are a referralbased specialty clinic. After evaluation by a primary care manager, patients may be referred for GYN care for issues that include but not limited to cervical dysplasia; abnormal bleeding, pelvic pain, ovarian cysts, or infertility. Well woman visits do not require a consult and patients may self-refer for an appointment. For non-emergent issues that are not pregnancy related, please contact your primary care provider.

Access To Care

All new OB patients may self-refer to the Women's Health Clinic. You do not need to see your primary care provider for a referral. A repeat pregnancy test is not necessary once your home pregnancy test is positive. When self-referring to the clinic, you will need to fill-out paperwork and we will assist you in scheduling your OB orientation and first physical appointments. This process will take an average of 10 to 15 minutes.

Labor and Delivery Unit BACH Building A, Second Floor 270-798-8090

The Labor and Delivery team is committed to providing comprehensive family-centered care to all active duty Soldiers and their TRICRE eligible family members. The team's goal is to partner with the patient and family to ensure a safe birth in the manner most suitable to the needs of the patient and baby. We encourage skin-toskin contact with your baby immediately after delivery and to remain together while you are on Labor and Delivery. This will give both of you a great start to breastfeeding success, bonding, and caring for your newborn. All your Labor and Delivery nurses are trained to help you get the best start for this new and exciting journey.

All guests and visitors must sign in at the front desk and all siblings under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. For the safety of our patients, guests with cold or flu-like symptoms should delay visiting the newborn at this time.

Telephone consultation and triage is available 24/7. For any emergent/urgent pregnancy related issues for 20 weeks and above, please call or go to the Labor and Delivery unit. For non-emergent pregnancyrelated issues, please contact the Women's

Health Clinic either by Army Secure Messaging System at any time or by phone during clinic business hours. Please refer to the Women's Health Clinic (OB/GYN) section for further Information.

Lactation Services BACH Building A, Third Floor in Women's Health/OBGYN, 270-798-8151, Option 1

Reasons to see a consultant before you deliver: You want to learn as much as you can about breastfeeding; if you had breastfeeding or lactation difficulty in the past; expecting more than one baby or a baby who may be sick or early; you have a history of breast surgery and wonder if it will affect your breastfeeding; you think your breasts or nipples look odd to you or are very different from each other; or you worry that something about your health might make it hard to breastfeed.

Reasons to see a lactation consultant after you deliver: If you are concerned about your baby's weight; you have questions and concerns about how your infant is acting during or after feeding; you feel you may have too much or too little milk; your provider or your baby's provider sends you for help or you or your baby is hospitalized during the time you are a nursing couple.

A lactation consultant can help you identify the cause of a problem affecting breastfeeding for milk production; make suggestions about how to correct a problem; work with you to decide on a plan of care; suggest supplies or tools you can use to improve your breastfeeding experience (some supplies are provided during consultations if the lactation consultant confirms there is a need); provide you with written education and/or instructions; share information about other breastfeeding support and resources in the community; and provide follow-up consultations as needed.

Breastfeeding Classes and Peer Support at BACH

Third Trimester Breastfeeding Class: Covers position and latch techniques, how to assess for milk transfer from mother to infant, how human milk production occurs and reviews common breastfeeding concerns.

The MOM and ME Group: A place and time breastfeeding mothers can gather together with their breastfeeding infant and develop relationships with other breastfeeding mothers in the community. This is a place to share information and experiences with other mothers. An International Board Certified Lactation Consultant will be present during this group session to offer support, address questions and recommend follow-up if needed. An infant scale is available for use by the mothers.

Pump Programs

TRICARE covers breast pumps and breast pump supplies at no cost for new mothers, including mothers who adopt an infant and plan to breastfeed. You must have a prescription from a TRICAREauthorized physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or nurse midwife. The prescription will state which type of breast pump you need:

- Hospital-grade breast pump
- Manual breast pump
- Standard electric breast pump

If you paid out-of-pocket, you can send a claim for reimbursement with a copy of your prescription and itemized receipt. Learn more at www.tricare.mil/breastpumps.

Mother Baby Unit BACH Building A, Second Floor 270-798-8090

The Mother-Baby Unit is located near the Labor, Delivery and Recovery Unit to provide patient and family-centered maternity and newborn care with minimum disruption and separation following birth. The unit has a Level I Special Care Nursery to provide advanced care for infants requiring further post-delivery transition needs. Healthy infants who do not require advanced care will share their mothers' room during their post-partum period. The mother and family are welcome to invite adults and siblings to the room. Siblings under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult other than the patient. For the safety of the baby, guests with cold or flulike symptoms are encouraged not to visit the unit. It is recommended that no one other than the deemed support person stay overnight due to space limitations and the comfort of other patients receiving care.

An Exceptional Family Member (EFM) is a family member (child or adult) with any physical, emotional, developmental or intellectual disability that requires special treatment, therapy, education, training or counseling.

The following Soldiers with EFMs must enroll in the program: active Army, U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) Soldiers in the USAR-Active Guard Reserve program and Army National Guard (ARNG) personnel. Enrollment allows assignment managers at Department of the Army Human Resource Command (HRC) personnel agencies to consider the documented medical and special education needs of the EFM in the assignment process. All family members applying to accompanying a Soldier to an overseas assignment are required to be screened through the EFMP to ensure any special considerations are identified prior to relocation. When possible, Soldiers are assigned to an area where their EFM's medical and special education needs can be met. This decision will depend on a valid personnel requirement for the Soldier's grade, specialty and eligibility for the tour. All Soldiers are still eligible for worldwide assignment.

The Child and Family Behavioral Health System (CAFBHS) offers a family-based approach to behavioral health care. Services offered include assessment and diagnosis, individual therapy, family therapy, parent education, school consultation, psychological testing, and medication management for family members 18 years of age and younger. Additionally, CAFBHS provides schoolbased behavioral health services to children attending schools on Fort Campbell, as well as marital and family therapy through our marriage and family therapists.

Offered at all on-post schools, School Behavioral Health provides treatment for children and adolescents attending schools on Fort Campbell. Independently licensed behavioral health providers are embedded within each on-post school to provide ease of access to care. The providers assist children and families with behavior modification, mood management, improving self-esteem, coping strategies and problem solving, decisionmaking skills, stress management, communication skills, social skills and peer relationship building, dealing with change or loss, deployment/reunification support and strengthening family relationships, and parent education. 

A 20,500-square-foot building houses the SRU Detachment headquarters, which can accommodate 94 Soldier leaders who care for wounded, ill and injured Soldiers. The 8,100-square-foot SRU headquarters can accommodate 24 battalion support staff and leaders.

The complex is directly across the street from Blanchfield Army Community Hospital, where Soldiers receive much of their medical care.

WEAPONS REGISTRATION

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Every day the Fort Campbell Military Police works to increase roadway safety in order to reduce deaths, injuries, and economic losses from motor vehicle crashes. Local traffic regulations facilitate the safe flow of traffic and accident prevention and help educate and guide vehicle operators to respect traffic laws and safety regulations. All motor vehicle operators should familiarize themselves with Army Regulation 190-5, CAM Regulation 190-5, and the laws pertaining to the states of Kentucky and Tennessee. Law enforcement has been tremendously effective in deterring Soldiers, family members, and guests of Fort Campbell from unsafe driving behaviors that risk the lives of everyone living and working within the community.

All violators are subject to legal, disciplinary, and administrative action.

Speed Limits

Unless otherwise posted, the speed limit on Fort Campbell is 25 mph. In other areas, speed is limited to:

- 10 mph in parking areas and when passing troop formations.
- 20 mph in school areas.
- 25 mph in housing areas.
- 35 mph for tactical vehicles in rear areas.
- 45 mph for non-tactical vehicles on rear area roads.


Parking

Parking privately owned or U.S. government vehicles on Fort Campbell's main streets is prohibited except where such parking is authorized by designated spaces or for service vehicles conducting authorized business. The shoulders of the road cannot be used for parking except for the case of a temporarily disabled vehicle.

Any parked vehicle creating an obstruction may be towed off the installation by a civilian wrecker service at the owner's expense.

Off-Limit Areas

In accordance with CAM Reg 210-1, it is unlawful and a criminal offense for any person to enter, or be found upon, an




"off-limits" establishment, an area described in the current "off-limits" list published by the installation or higher headquarters, or any specifically posted or designated "offlimits" areas on this reservation.

Areas specifically designated as "offlimits" areas include, but are not limited to:

- · Family housing areas. All family housing areas are off-limits to all personnel except residents, guests, and persons on official business. All CCLLC Common Areas (to include playgrounds and picnic areas) require parent or legal guardian supervision 30 minutes after sunset. Exceptions will be made for CCLLC sponsored events. This regulation does not supersede or amend the child supervision guidelines located in CAM Reg 608-3.
- · Parking lots. All parking lots on the reservation are off-limits during hours of darkness, except while parking or picking up vehicles. The following activities are specifically prohibited during these hours: mechanical repairs on vehicles, sitting or sleeping in parked vehicles, and loitering in or about parked vehicles.

• Training and Wooded areas. All training areas and wooded areas located on the reservation are off-limits, except when authorized by range control or Division G-3 scheduling and/or when participating in authorized recreational activities and in possession of a valid area assignment issued by outdoor recreation.

All rock quarries, both active and abandoned, within Kentucky and Tennessee are



off-limits for all purposes. The only exceptions to this prohibition are:

- The Cerulean Spring Quarry in Cadiz, Kentucky, may be used for scuba diving only during operating hours.
- Martha's Quarry, east of Lebanon, Tennessee, may be used by certified divers and dive students accompanied by a certified instructor only. Due to the high cliffs, non-diving recreational use is not permitted.
- Cowan Quarry, south of Cowan, Tennessee, may be used by certified divers and dive students accompanied by a certified instructor only. Due to the high cliffs, non-diving recreational use is not permitted.
- Hopkinsville Diving Quarry, off Exit 9, adjacent to Pennyrile Parkway and 680. Non-diving recreational use is not permitted. Military personnel observed in off-limits establishments are in violation of a lawful general order and are subject to apprehension for violation of Article 92, UCMJ.

Off-limits establishments are prohibited from advertising on the installation.



The ASAP Specialists focus on prevention. ASAP Specialists provide a full-range of prevention services: risk reduction and mitigation, prevention education, and suicide prevention awareness. ASAP Specialists are assigned to specific units and provide services to analyze data, mitigate risk, collaborate with installation agencies, train units, develop training, and provide suicide prevention assistance to units. ASAP Specialists are also responsible for campaign planning, Army Drug and Alcohol Prevention Training (ADAPT), and the UPL Course.

Employee Assistance Program 270-798-0079

The Fort Campbell Employee Assistance Program (EAP) provides free, confidential services to Fort Campbell's civilian employees and their family members, and on a space-available basis, to Fort Campbell retirees, active-duty Soldiers assigned to Fort Campbell, and their Family members. The EAP provides a variety of individually-based services: screenings to identify solutions to employee problems; short-term "solution-focused intervention;" and, when appropriate, referral to providers, facilities, or other services that can assist the employee in resolving his or her problems. EAP also provides training for employees, managers, and supervisors for the prevention and intervention of/in poor job performance, absenteeism, and workplace incidents that could result in accidents or injury.



Suicide Prevention 270-412-0080

Leaders at all levels have the responsibility to protect their Soldiers on and off the battlefield. This includes recognizing uncharacteristic and suicidal behaviors. Effective suicide prevention requires everyone in the unit to be aware of the risk factors for suicide and know how to respond. If a Soldier seems suicidal, the time to take action is now. Distress can lead to the development of unhealthy behaviors. People closest to the Soldier (fellow Soldiers, family, and friends) are in the best position to recognize changes due to stress or depression and to provide support.

LOOK FOR:

- Comments that suggest thoughts or plans of suicide.
- Relationship problems (loss of girlfriend or boyfriend, divorce).
- Uncharacteristic behaviors (e.g., reckless driving, excessive drinking, stealing).
- Significant change in work performance or attitude.
- Depressed mood, hopelessness.
- Withdrawal from social activities.

WHAT TO DO

In any situation, if a Soldier threatens suicide, take it seriously. You may have



very limited time and only one chance to intervene.

Remember the acronym "ACE"

- Ask: Ask the question directly: "Are you thinking of killing yourself?"
- Care: Remain calm and actively listen to produce relief.
- Escort: Never leave your buddy alone. Get him or her to the chain of command, to a chaplain, or to the emergency room.

Army Emergency Relief (AER) provides financial assistance in emergency situations to all active-duty Soldiers and their dependents, retired military personnel and their families, and Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers who have been on continuous active duty for 30 days or more. Assistance is provided on a case-by-case basis; common examples include: non-receipt of pay and allowances, emergency transportation and vehicle repair, initial rent and deposits, threat of eviction, essential utilities, privation, emergency medical or dental treatments, and other emergency circumstances.

To apply for AER assistance, Soldiers can either obtain an AER Form 101 application from their unit chain of command or in person at the AER Office: Commander/1SG Quick Assist Program (active duty Soldiers only). AER routine assistance requests for E-1 or above with 12 months active duty do not require command signature. Assumption of Command orders are also needed for anyone signing as the Acting Commander. Spouses will need an AER Special Power of Attorney (AER Form 53) or the Soldier's verified authorization to obtain an AER Ioan. All applicants must show a valid military ID card, the latest Leave and Earnings Statement, proof of a financial emergency, and any additional documentation as needed. A checklist of the required documentation may be obtained in person at 2601 Indiana Ave.

The Fort Campbell ACS Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) serves approximately 2,300 individuals with special needs. EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program that works in partnership with various military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated community support, housing, educational and medical support, and personnel services to families with special needs. An Exceptional Family Member (EFM) is a family member (child or adult) with any physical, emotional, developmental, or intellectual disability that requires special treatment, therapy, education, training, or counseling.

The following Soldiers with EFMs must enroll in the program: active Army, U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) Soldiers in the USAR-Active Guard Reserve program, and ARNG personnel.

Enrollment allows assignment managers at Department of the Army Human Resources Command (HRC) to consider the documented medical and special education needs of the EFM in the assignment process. When possible, Soldiers are assigned to an area where their EFM's medical and special education needs can be met. This

decision will depend on a valid personnel requirement for the Soldier's grade, specialty, and eligibility for the tour. All Soldiers are still eligible for worldwide assignment.

The EFMP also conducts a variety of recreational and cultural events during the year.

Hours: 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Closed Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day, and other federal holidays. Admission is free.

Memorabilia from Brig. Gen. Don F. Pratt, along with some of the personal possessions of Gens. William C. Lee, Maxwell D. Taylor, Anthony C. McAuliffe, and William C. Westmoreland, are among the featured exhibits.

Other exhibits include a restored CG-4A cargo glider that carried glider-borne Soldiers into combat during World War II, as well as uniforms and equipment of the American Soldier and his enemies from the European and Pacific theaters of WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Operation Desert Storm, and the global war on terrorism.

There are also captured personal items of Adolf Hitler, Herman Goering, and other high-ranking Nazi officials. Although the main museum theme focuses on the history of the 101st Airborne Division, there are also displays that address early developments in airborne warfare and Camp Campbell as an Armor Training Center in WWII.

Included in the displays are the following units: the 11th Airborne Division, the 12th Armored Division, the 14th Armored Division, the 20th Armored Division, the 26th Infantry Division, the 173rd Airborne Brigade, the 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team, the 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) and the 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment (Airborne). An outdoor park across the street from the museum displays military aircraft and equipment used by or captured by the division. The centerpiece of the park is the "Brass Hat" — a C-47 aircraft resembling the plane used to carry the division commander, Maj. Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, into Holland during Operation Market Garden in World War II.

The museum's primary mission is to train Soldiers; to that end, a reference library and archives are available for Soldiers and units. Both guided and unguided tours (reservations required for guided tours), daily historical films, a gift shop, gallery talks, lectures, and educational programs, including foreign weapons training, are available. Call for more information or to schedule tours, training, or briefings. The museum also conducts weekly new-Soldier briefings to introduce new Soldiers to the history, heritage, and values of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault).

The museum also has displays in the nearby McAuliffe Hall, the 101st Airborne Division Command and Control Facility, which are open to the public, and includes the 101st Airborne Division Association Monument outside. In the foyer, there are displays dedicated to McAuliffe, for whom the building is named, a rotunda honoring the division's Medal of Honor recipients, a collection of bronze sculptures of airborne Soldiers from WWII to the present day, and an exhibit dedicated to "Old Abe," the Civil War eagle mascot whose image is the origin of the famous Screaming Eagle shoulder patch of the 101st Airborne Division.



Military Affairs Committee

The Military Affairs Committee includes representatives from Fort Campbell, retired military members, government officials and local business leaders. Location and Climate

Founded on the banks of the Cumberland and Red rivers 45 miles northwest of Nashville, Clarksville's population is approximately 150,000, while Montgomery County tops 195,000. Clarksville enjoys a mild Southern climate with four distinct seasons.

Economy

Clarksville's growing industries include agriculture, construction, education, entertainment, health care and retail. Major employers include the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County Government, Tennova Healthcare, the Clarksville-Montgomery County School System, Austin Peay State University, and industrial employers like Agero, Akebono, Convergys, Jostens Printing & Publishing and Trane Co.



Education

The Clarksville-Montgomery County School System serves more than 33,000 students in 39 schools. Approximately 29 percent of the students served in the school system are military dependents. CMCSS continues to be recognized nationally for its academic and professional achievements, as well as its progressive methods for helping students become college and career ready. In 2016, the system was number one in the state for academic growth.

For parents seeking an alternative to the traditional school system, Clarksville offers several private and religious schools.

Clarksville business and technical schools offer students the opportunity to seek positions in the service industry or they can provide additional training to those already established in their careers.

LAND BETWEEN THE LAKES

Land Between the Lakes is the largest inland peninsula in the United States. Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area manages more than 170,000 acres as part of the U.S. Forest Service and the Department of Agriculture's public lands program. Located in western Kentucky and Tennessee, the area draws approximately 1.5 million visitors annually. With 300 miles of undeveloped shoreline on Kentucky and Barkley lakes, the area offers outdoor recreation and numerous facilities. Facilities include a nature station, a living history farm, a planetarium and observatory, a horseback riding campground and stables, an off-highway vehicle area, the Elk & Bison Prairie, the Iron Industry Ruins, gift shops and visitor information centers.

Outdoor Recreation

There are more than 500 miles of trails and roughly 200 miles of scenic roads for hiking, biking, horseback riding and taking in the area's scenic beauty. Campers can choose from 1,400 campsites, ranging from RV sites with shower and restroom facilities to primitive campsites. Many campsites offer lake access. Other outdoor recreation opportunities include birding, fishing, geocaching, hunting, swimming, target shooting and more.

History

Land Between the Lakes has three sites on the National Register of Historic Places: Fort Henry, site of a major Civil War battle; the Center Furnace; and the Great Western Iron Furnace. The region was primarily an iron production center during the mid-19th century. The ruins of two of the area's iron furnaces are accessible to visitors.

Wildlife and Plants

Land Between the Lakes has the largest publicly owned bison herd east of the Mississippi River and more than 1,300 plant species, approximately 260 bird species and 55 different mammal species. Land Between the Lakes was an active participant in the nation's efforts to re-establish the eagle population in western Kentucky and Tennessee. Other wildlife includes bats, bobcats, coyotes, deer, foxes, herons, hummingbirds, muskrats, osprey, squirrels, turkeys, turtles, vultures, woodpeckers and more. For more information about recent wildlife sightings and wildlife viewing opportunities, stop by the Woodlands Nature Station.

Attractions

Attractions at Land Between the Lakes include the Homeplace living history farm, Woodlands Nature Station, Elk & Bison Prairie, and Golden Pond Planetarium and Observatory.

The Homeplace, in the southern portion of Land Between the Lakes, allows visitors to experience life much as it was in mid-19th century rural America. Through a blending of artifacts, historic structures and the re-creation of farm activities, the Homeplace gives visitors a glimpse of the traditions and lifestyles of this era in American history.

The nature station offers special events throughout the year in addition to the regular calendar of programs and demonstrations. Among the most popular events are guided bald eagle excursions. These van and boat tours take visitors into the field to see the migratory bald eagle population wintering in the area.

The Elk & Bison Prairie is another fascinating Land between the Lakes attraction. Opened in June 1996, this 700-acre area is a restoration of the native prairie habitat that thrived in western Kentucky and upper middle Tennessee over 200 years ago. Native wildlife such as elk and bison inhabit the prairie. Visitors can take a self-guided driving tour of the prairie along a 3.5-mile paved loop featuring interpretive stops.

The Golden Pond Planetarium is inside the Golden Pond Visitor Center. The planetarium features an 81-seat theater and offers state-of-the-art planetarium shows year-round. It's also home to the Western Kentucky Amateur Astronomers, which holds meetings and stargazing sessions.

NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE

Known as the music city, Nashville is approximately 45 miles south of Fort Campbell on Interstate 24. With big-city attractions just a short drive away, many Soldiers and their families make Nashville the hub of their recreational and cultural adventures.

Shopping

Nashville has become a major retail center for shoppers. The city includes several shopping malls — The Mall at Green Hills, CoolSprings Galleria, Opry Mills, Lebanon Outlet Marketplace and more. Shoppers looking for more unique items might prefer the shops in the surrounding neighborhoods such as 12 South, East Nashville, Germantown and Hillsboro Village.

Recreation

The parks and recreation department oversees more than 15,000 acres of open space, including 184 parks and 85 miles of greenway. Numerous playgrounds, swimming pools, tennis courts, golf courses and an indoor ice-skating rink extend the city's leisure-time activities. Two man-made lakes - Old Hickory and Percy Priest - are located just minutes from downtown, providing easy access to water sports, fishing and waterfowl hunting. 

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Third party monitoring of a telephone conversation is prohibited unless all parties give consent. This also applies to use of hands-free speaker telephones when more than one person is present at hands-free locations. It is a misdemeanor for anyone to use the telephone as a means of conveying obscene or indecent language or to make anonymous or repeated calls to annoy, abuse, embarrass or harass.

Do not discuss classified Information on unsecure telephones. SECURE telephones are available for FOUO, sensitive and classified information.

DOD telephones are provided for the transmission of official government Information only and are subject to communications security monitoring at all times. Use of official DOD telephones constitutes consent to communications security telephone monitoring in accordance with DOD Directive 4640.6.

FRAUDULENT USE OF TELEPHONE SERVICE

Any person who attempts to avoid payment of Telecommunications Service by charging such service to an unauthorized telephone number or credit card number, or who uses any other code, prearranged scheme, method, trick or device to defraud is in violation of both federal and state laws.

The law of Tennessee provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to obtain or attempt to obtain telephone service by fraudulent means with the intent to avoid payment for lawful charges. This includes not only the obtaining of local service, but devices, means or methods, with intent to avoid payment. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof will be punished by imprisonment for one to five years unless value of services exceeds \$100, in which case violators are subject to imprisonment for three to 10 years. Tennessee Code, 39-3-505. Kentucky state law provides that no persons shall obtain telephone services by deception or by false token or by using or possessing a device for theft of telephone services.

Violators, upon conviction, are subject to imprisonment for up to one year and/or a fine of up to \$500, unless the value of the services is \$100 or more, in which case violators are subject to imprisonment for one to five years and/or a fine of up to \$10,000. Kentucky Revised Statutes, 514.060, 414.065.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Those persons found guilty of violating the Federal Fraud by Wire Statute may be fined \$1,000 or imprisoned for five years, or both, for each such violation. 18 U.S.C. 1343.

Violations of this federal law are investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

USE OF THE MILITARY SYSTEM

1. General:

- a. This official telephone directory is published for information and use by personnel at Fort Campbell. Regulations governing use and installation of telephones are contained in AR 25-1.
- b. The responsibility for the care, safeguarding and proper use of telephone equipment rests upon the individual in whose office, or under whose care, telephones are installed.

2. Classes of Service:

- a. Class AA. Service provided to conduct official Department of the Army business with direct or operator-assisted access to the DSN, commercial and local off-post circuits.
- b. Class A-1. Service provided to conduct official Department of the Army business with direct access to the DSN and local off-post circuits.
- c. Class A. Service provided for the transaction of official business. It is confined to the intra-PBX and local commercial area and is restricted from direct or operator-assisted routine DSN access — local off post only.
- d. Class C. Service authorized for official government business only. These telephones do not have access to off-post trunk lines, operator or directory assistance.

3. Application for Telephone Services:

- Official Telephone Service: Official requests for telephone installations, moves, removals or changes.
- b. Quarters Telephones: Requests for telephone installations, removals, relocations or changes will be through Campbell Crossing (Housing Office: 931-431-9003).

4. Official Telephone Information Assistance:

- a. Fort Campbell Directory Assistance Dial 0 (798-2151).
- b. Telephone Repair Service. The TCO must submit a trouble ticket on the phone number via Remedy; you will have access to four choices. Select the proper action. If the TCO does not have access to Remedy they must call 866-335-ARMY (2769) and have the help desk put the trouble ticket in for them.
- c. DSN prefixes are 798=635, 956=363, 412=352, and 461=541.
- d. Responsibilities of subscriber procedures for control of official calls are described in paragraphs 5 and 6 and are contained in AR 25-1.

5. Unit Responsibilities:

 Any digging, excavating, driving of posts or pilings will require an approved dig permit. Dig permits will be obtained by contacting Tennessee One-Call 72 hours in advanced at 800-351-1111.

- b. Fort Campbell telephone equipment specialists or telephone contractors are authorized to move, alter, place attachments on or make additions to the telephone systems equipment.
- c. Tactical equipment (e.g., field wire, switchboards and telephones) will not be used to supplement, replace or duplicate the administrative (dial) telephone system within any troop or administrative building.
- Official telephone systems are subject to monitoring at all times. Use of a government telephone constitutes consent to monitoring.
- e. The TCO will notify the Telephone Management Section of all changes to telephone listings by using FC Form 4175.
- f. Each individual is responsible for calls placed over his/her assigned telephone and for proper use and care of telephone equipment. Each individual is responsible for protecting telephones, wires and connectors from moisture.

6. Telephone Control Officer's Responsibilities:

- a. Each major unit, battalion, separate battalion/ activity and staff office will appoint a telephone control officer (TCO) and an alternate TCO. Requests for telephone service must be routed through the TCO before they will be accepted by NEC.
- b. The TCO will review and approve all work orders prior to submission to NEC. Requirements for extensive service should be coordinated personally with NEC well in advance (60 days) of required service date. "Extensive" service is defined as anything other than a routine office telephone installation or move, to include installation or moves of more than six instruments at a time.
- c. TCOs will ensure timely and accurate submissions of listings/changes to the telephone directory.
- d. The TCO will control distribution of all telephone directories for his/her area of responsibility.
- e. TCOs will attend all quarterly IMO/TCO meetings.
- f. Defense Switched Network (DSN) operators at other posts will normally extend an official DSN call off post within the local call area.
- g. Commercial service is available for official business by dialing 98 + 1 + AC + seven-digit telephone numbers.
- h. Charges for unauthorized calls will be paid by the person responsible. NEC personnel may assist in investigating calls and defining responsibilities for such calls as may be considered questionable. NEC personnel (798-9647/9651) will advise TCO on preparation of paperwork for collection.
- Commercial toll calls should not be placed to government activities that have access to the DSN network. Commercial calls may be placed in lieu of DSN only when the urgency of the call cannot wait for DSN circuit availability.

7. Standards of Service:

a. Telephone operators are no longer available at Fort Campbell. The Automated Directory Assistance Service (ADAS) is available 24 hours. The www.campbell.army.mil website is also available for numbers that are not found on the automated directory. Concerns regarding service will be made to the Transmissions Branch chief, NEC telephone 798-9879.

BOMB THREATS, THREATENING AND **OBSCENE TELEPHONE CALLS**

Bomb threats, physical threatening or obscene telephone calls can be a problem. If you receive such calls, follow these instructions to assist military police and telephone security personnel in the identifying potential offenders.

Procedures for Persons Receiving Bomb Threat Calls

Refer to the Department of Homeland Security Bomb Threat Information Card. These cards are available at http://emilms.fema.gov/is906/assets/ ocso-bomb_threat_samepage-brochure.pdf. Follow procedures outlined on the form if you receive a bomb threat. A copy of the form must be readily available near your telephone at all times. If a bomb threat is received via telephone do not hang up the telephone, contact the military police. telephone 798-7111, give your name, location, and the number of the telephone on which you were called. Immediately notify the senior official of the unit/facility threatened.

Procedures for Persons Receiving Annoving or Obscene Telephone Calls

a. Always get the caller's identification. If the caller asks "Who is this?" refuse to answer. Instead,

ask, "What number did you call?" or "Whom do you wish to speak to?"

GENERAL INFORMATION

- b. If you have small children, instruct them to NEVER talk to strangers on the phone. A child's comment that Daddy and Mommy are out for the evening could set up your home for robbery or worse circumstances.
- c. Adults should never give information about themselves or their home to telephone callers they don't know. That includes "salesmen" and "survey" operations, etc.
- d. If a caller remains silent when you answer the phone, hang up immediately. If the caller persists, contact the military police, telephone 798-7111. for assistance.
- e. If you are a woman living alone, never list your full name in the telephone book. Use your initials and last name.
- f. Report any obscene or threatening telephone calls to the police. When answering such calls, remain calm. Don't repeatedly ask who he/she is or what he/she wants. Many callers want to upset or scare you. Hang up if the caller begins threatening or obscene remarks.

The military police, telephone 798-7111, will assist you with more detailed Information on annoyance calls.

BOMB THREAT CALL PROCEDURES

Most bomb threats are received by phone. Bomb threats are serious until proven otherwise. Act quickly, but remain calm and obtain information with the checklist on the reverse of this card.

If a bomb threat is received by phone:

- 1. Remain calm. Keep the caller on the line for as long as possible. DO NOT HANG UP, even if the caller does.
- 2. Listen carefully. Be polite and show interest.
- Try to keep the caller talking to learn more information. 3
- If possible, write a note to a colleague to call the authorities or, as soon as the 4. caller hangs up, immediately notify them yourself.
- 5. If your phone has a display, copy the number and/or letters on the window display.
- Complete the Bomb Threat Checklist (reverse side) immediately. Write down as 6. much detail as you can remember. Try to get exact words.
- 7 Immediately upon termination of the call, do not hang up, but from a different phone, contact FPS immediately with information and await instructions.

TELEPHONE USER'S GUIDE

INTRODUCTION

This basic user's guide describes the most commonly used features and includes basic instructions for feature operation. The guide also includes the trunk/network access codes. At the end of the guide is a quick reference list of the basic feature codes. The Fort Campbell telephone book includes additional frequently used features.

BASIC DIALING INSTRUCTIONS

TO CALL ANOTHER STATION INSIDE THE FORT CAMPBELL INSTALLATION:

- 1. Go off-hook.
- 2. Listen for DIAL TONE.
- 3. Dial the seven-digit station code (798-XXXX, 956-0000 through 4999, 412-XXXX, 461-XXXX).
- 4. DSN Numbers: 798=635, 956=363, 412=352, 461=541.

TO CALL A LOCAL COMMERCIAL NUMBER (AREA CODES 270/931) OUTSIDE THE FORT CAMPBELL INSTALLATION:

1. Go off-hook.

- 2. Listen for DIAL TONE.
- 3. Dial the LOCAL access code "99."
- 4. Dial the 10-digit (270/931) telephone number.
- 5. Note You will receive second dial tone after the "99."

TO CALL A TOLL NUMBER OUTSIDE THE FORT CAMPBELL INSTALLATION BUT WITHIN THE 270/931 AREA CODE:

- 1. Go off-hook.
- 2. Listen for DIAL TONE.
- 3. Dial the FTS access code "97" or "98."
- 4. Dial the 1 + 10-digit telephone number.
- Note You will receive second dial tone after the "97" or "98."

TO CALL A TOLL NUMBER OUTSIDE THE FORT CAMPBELL INSTALLATION AND OUTSIDE THE 270/931 AREA CODE:

- 1. Go off-hook.
- 2. Listen for DIAL TONE.
- 3. Dial the FTS access code "97" or "98."
- 4. Dial the 1 + ten-digit (CONUS) to 15-digit (OCONUS) number.
- 5. Note You will receive second dial tone after the "97" or "98."

TO PLACE A CALL OVER THE DSN

- (DEFENSE SWITCHED NETWORK):
- 1. Go off-hook.
- 2. Listen for DIAL TONE.
- 3. Dial the DSN ROUTINE access code "94."
- Dial the seven/10-digit DSN telephone number (seven-digit CONUS; 10-digit OCONUS). Assumes user has appropriate class-of-service authorization.

BASIC FEATURES

Call Transfer/Three-Way Calling

Call Transfer enables you to transfer an established call to another telephone number (certain restrictions may apply concerning transfers of long-distance calls). With **Three-Way Calling** you can add a third party on to an existing call. Both features include **Consultation Hold** capability, which allows you to consult privately with the third party before establishing the **Three-Way Calling** or **Call Transfer** feature.

TO TRANSFER A CALL:

- Press the SWITCHHOOK or FLASH key (your call is now placed on consultation hold).

- 2. Dial the Call Pickup activation code 149.
- 3. Identify yourself to the caller.

To pick up a ringing call when you already on an established call:

- 1. Advise your caller you need to answer a ringing line.
- 2. Press the SWITCHHOOK or FLASH key (call is placed on consultation hold).
- 3. Listen for SPECIAL DIAL TONE.
- Dial the **Call Pickup** activation code **149**.
 Identify yourself to the caller.

To end the picked up call and return to your call on hold:

- 1. Hang up your phone.
- 2. Wait for the ring back signal.
- 3. Answer and resume the conversation.

Call Forward Variable

Call Forward Variable allows you to forward your incoming calls to another telephone number on Fort Campbell. When **Call Forwarding Variable** is activated, your calls will be automatically routed to the number you programmed.

When **Call Forwarding Variable** is activated you will still be free to originate other calls. An operational short ring signal (ring reminder) may be provided to let you know each time a call is being forwarded.

Call Park

Call Park allows you to park a call against your station line. The parked call remains in a special held status while you are free to:

- Return to a previously held call.
- Maintain the caller in a confidential status until you return to a call.

The "parked" call can then be retrieved from your telephone or any other location on the Fort Campbell installation by using the Call Park retrieve feature.

Voice Mail

Voice Mail is a feature that not all telephones on Fort Campbell have access to. Voice Mail is requested on case-by-case bases through the unit telephone control officer utilizing a Fort Campbell Telephone Service Request form. The Voice Mail dial-in number is 798-1500 for all users and the initial pass code is set to 123456. If a user's mailbox has been locked out due to inactivity or an incorrect pass code, a trouble ticket must be submitted to the NEC to reset the old user pass code to a temporary (1234) pass code to allow access. Once logged in with the temporary pass code the user will be required to change the pass code to a six- to eight-digit number that can't be the user's current Fort Campbell telephone number. The pass code is good for 365 days and will prompt the user prior to expiration. If users do not use their pass code within 90 days the account will lock.

Meet Me Conferences

Telephone Conferencing enables you to have multiple parties/calls tied together for a telephone conference call. For security reasons, this capability will need to be set-up through the Telecommunications Section, which will assign a conference identification code number.

Users will dial **270-798-3584**, to reach the Telecommunications Section personnel to schedule a conference. To participate in the conference call users will then dial 270-798-7707 and follow the prompts to enter the conference ID number, which when successfully entered will connect the users to the conference call.

Requests for a conference access code with a conference start time after duty hours must be booked with the Telecommunications Section personnel during duty hours to obtain the required conference ID number.

After the conference has been conducted, the access code will expire and cannot be used again for another conference call. The conference call is only good for the time block the customer requested.


