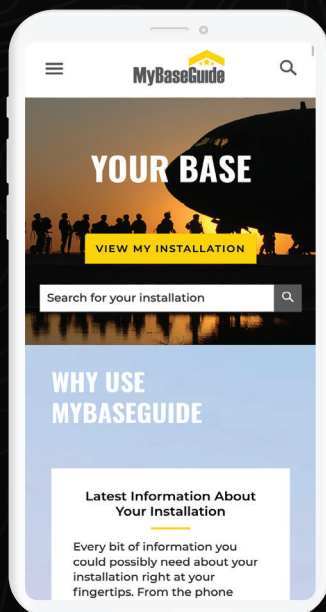

THE EARLY YEARS

The Kings Bay region is a pleasant place to live, as shown by the fact people have populated the area for thousands of years. Archeological research conducted over the past 35 years has revealed a pre-Columbian Indian presence throughout the area.

Early in the 19th century, much of what is now a bustling, modern submarine base was the site of several plantations, including Cherry Point, Harmony Hall, New Canaan, Marianna and Kings Bay. Along the bay, Maj. Thomas King purchased property in 1791 and developed a small- to medium-sized plantation overlooking Cumberland Island. Investigations by University of Florida archaeologists revealed a broad spectrum of previously unknown information about the life of the plantation owner of the day.

Cherry Point is on the north end of the base originally granted by the governor of Georgia to John King in 1792. The King family (no relation to Thomas King) lived there from 1792 to 1823. His son James sold the plantation to John Houston McIntosh and moved west to present-day Kingsland.

McIntosh built several considerably larger plantations known as New Canaan, where he grew cotton and sugar cane, and Marianna Plantation, on the former Cherry Point property. Just west of the Stimson

Gate, across Georgia Highway Spur 40, lays the two-story tabby ruin of McIntosh's sugar mill.

Point Peter is the site of one of the last major military engagements of the War of 1812 in January 1815, when the British landed in force on Cumberland Island, then staged a two-pronged attack against the fort. The Americans retreated and made a last stand against the invaders along what is now Kamehameha Avenue on lower base. A peace treaty ending the War of 1812 was signed in Belgium in December 1814, but the soldiers, far removed from Europe, knew nothing of the treaty. The British then destroyed the fort, barracks and magazine. After occupying and looting Point Peter, Cumberland Island and St. Marys, the British left in early March 1815. An exhibit about the fort and battle is on display at the Cumberland Island National Seashore Museum in downtown St. Marys.

THE ARMY YEARS

The Army began to acquire land at Kings Bay in 1954 to build a military ocean terminal to ship ammunition in case of a national emergency. Construction actively began in 1956 and was completed in 1958. Since there was no immediate operational need for the installation, it was placed in an inactive ready status.

The most prominent feature of the terminal was the 2,000-foot-long, 87-foot-wide concrete and steel wharf. In addition, three parallel railroad tracks would have enabled the simultaneous loading of several ammunition ships from rail cars and trucks.

Elsewhere aboard the base, the Army built 47 miles of railroad tracks. Spurs off the main line ran into temporary storage areas that were protected by earthen barricades. These mounds of dirt, still prominent features in many areas of the base, were designed to localize damage in case of explosive accidents.

Never activated to serve its primary purpose, the Army base was used for other missions. In 1964, as Hurricane Dora hammered the area, nearly 100 area residents were sheltered aboard the base. Also, during the Cuban missile crisis, an Army Transportation Battalion of 1,100 personnel and 70 small boats took up position at Kings Bay.

THE NAVY YEARS

The chain of events that led to today's combination of high-tempo submarine operations at Kings Bay and the complex construction project that reshaped the face of thousands of acres of land began in 1975. At the time, treaty negotiations between Spain and the United States were in progress. A proposed change to our base agreement with Spain was the withdrawal of the fleet ballistic-missile submarine squadron, Submarine Squadron 16, from its operational base at Rota, Spain. Anticipating this would take place, the chief of naval operations ordered studies to select a new refit site on the East Coast.

In January 1976, negotiators initialed a draft treaty between Spain and the U.S.; it called for withdrawal of the squadron from Rota by July 1979. The U.S. Congress ratified the treaty in June 1976.

A site-selection steering group evaluated more than 60 sites along the Atlantic and Gulf coasts. By summer 1976, the number of sites was narrowed to five: Narragansett Bay, Rhode Island; Cheatham Annex, Virginia; Charleston, South Carolina; Kings Bay, Georgia; and Mosquito Lagoon, Florida.

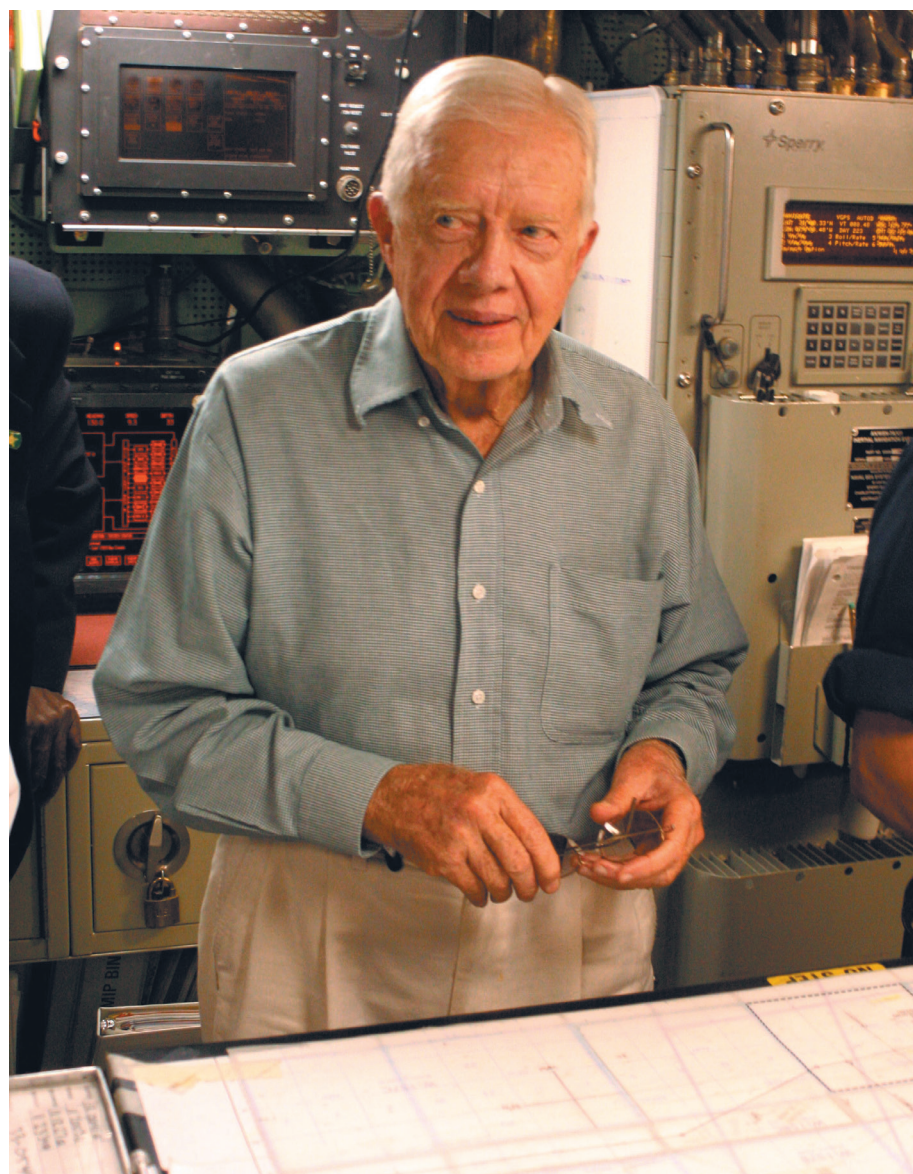
A comprehensive study evaluated each site against a number of criteria, including costs, ability to meet required schedule, land availability to meet explosive safety requirements, operational capabilities and logistics consideration, environmental impact and growth potential for future requirements. After careful review, the Navy selected Kings Bay.

The first Navy personnel arrived in the Kings Bay area in January 1978 and started preparations for the orderly transfer of property from the Army to the Navy. Naval Submarine Support Base Kings Bay was established

in a developmental status July 1, 1978. The base — now Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay — occupies the former Army terminal, as well as several thousand additional acres. Preparations for the arrival of the submarine squadron went forward in haste throughout the remainder of 1978 and into 1979. Commander Submarine Squadron 16 greeted the submarine tender USS Simon Lake (AS 33) when it arrived at Kings Bay on July 2, 1979. Four days later, USS James Monroe (SSBN 622) entered Kings Bay and moored

alongside USS Simon Lake to begin a routine refit in preparation for another deterrent patrol. Kings Bay has been an operating submarine base since that day.

In May 1979, the Navy selected Kings Bay as the preferred East Coast site for the Ohio-class submarine. On Oct. 23, 1980, after a one-year environmental impact study was completed and with congressional approval, the secretary of the Navy announced Kings Bay as the future home of the new Trident submarine. The building

HISTORY

project included the construction of three major commands: Trident Training Facility (TTF), Trident Refit Facility (TRF) and Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic (SWFLANT).

On Jan. 15, 1989, the first Trident submarine, USS Tennessee (SSBN 734), arrived at Kings Bay. The commissioning of USS Louisiana (SSBN 742) in September 1997 gave Kings Bay its full complement of 10 Trident submarines.

The enormous effort put forth by all the commands at Kings Bay reached fruition in late March 1990, when the Trident II (D-5) missile made its first deterrent patrol aboard USS Tennessee.

The end of the Cold War and the reorganization of military forces in the 1990s affected Kings Bay. A nuclear policy review recommended the Navy reduce the Ohio-class fleet ballistic-missile submarines from 18 to 14 by 2005.

To meet the review recommendation, the four oldest Ohio-class submarines were decommissioned and converted to conventional (SSGN) platforms. Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Nebraska, Maine and Louisiana shifted homeport to Naval Base Kitsap, Washington, as part of balancing the Trident fleet. USS Florida (SSGN 728) arrived at Kings Bay in May 2006 and USS Georgia (SSGN 729) arrived in 2007. In 2009, USS Alaska (SSBN 732) shifted homeport to Kings Bay.

In addition to being an integral part of our nation's strategic deterrence program, Kings Bay has attained and sustained award-winning results unsurpassed in Navy Region Southeast or other submarine and shore commands in the U.S. Navy.

In 2007, Kings Bay was named the top naval installation in the DOD when it received the commander in chief's installation excellence award for its ability to sustain its mission, increase productivity and enhance quality of life. In addition, the award recognized the base's creative management, new ideas and leadership. Kings Bay also received the Occupational Health and Safety Administration's highest safety rating in the Voluntary Protection Program and the secretary of the Navy and chief of naval operations Safety Ashore Award for the third consecutive year.

Kings Bay continues to take great pride in its mission and dedication to service; a base recognized for total commitment to innovation, quality of life, environmental awareness and community relations.



BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

GETTING HERE IS HALF THE FUN

Interstate 95 is the most direct route to this area and you can reach the base by taking exits 1, 3 or 6. Exit 1 takes you down St. Marys Road and ends at the Franklin Gate. From Exit 3, take Georgia State Highway 40 east toward St. Marys and turn left onto Kings Bay Road, which will take you to the Stimson Gate. Exit 6, Laurel Island Parkway, also leads to Kings Bay Road and to the Stimson Gate.

For those who choose to fly, Jacksonville International Airport is approximately 30 miles south of the base off Interstate 95.

PASS AND ID OFFICE

The Stimson Gate Pass and ID office hours are 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The Franklin Gate Pass and ID office hours are 6 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, closed Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

While the requirement for base decals has been removed, all privately owned vehicles on Navy installations must continue to be licensed, registered, inspected and insured in accordance with federal, state and local laws. Additionally, all privately owned vehicles of personnel permanently assigned (active duty, civilian, contractor) to SUBASE still must be registered in CLEOC at Pass and ID during in-processing — valid until the individual's identification (CAC) card expires — and will be de-registered during out-processing due to PCS or otherwise. Enforcement and verification of these requirements will be conducted through the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) and Random Antiterrorism Measures

(RAM). Rental vehicles are considered privately owned vehicles for the purposes of base entry and access control. The vehicle rental contract will suffice as proper licensing, registration and proof of insurance for base access.

Motorcycle operators must meet the same aforementioned minimum requirements. In addition, during STEP and the RAM program, operators of motorcycles will be required to provide proof that mandatory motorcycle education requirements have been met.

A 2005 DOD regulation restricts the use of cellphones while driving on all military installations. If taking a call, it is required for you to safely pull off to the side of the road. Seatbelt use is required on and off base and as always, keep safety in mind and practice sound risk management whenever driving or traveling in motor vehicles. Georgia state law requires headlights on for safety whenever it rains. Never drink and drive. If you do drink, use a designated driver or call a taxi or friend.

SPONSOR PROGRAM

So, you have orders to Kings Bay and the big question is what to do to prepare for the move. Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay has a great program to aid you with all the necessities of your move. The key to your smooth transition is your sponsor.

Once your orders are received by your prospective command, a welcome-aboard package will be sent to you and a sponsor assigned. In the welcome-aboard package, your sponsor will enclose a personal letter to welcome you and offer help with any concerns. Your sponsor should

contact you further to ensure your transition is as trouble-free as possible.

Whatever questions you have — big or small — your sponsor will help you find the answers. For more information about the sponsor program, call your receiving command or the base sponsor coordinator at 912-573-1391.

TEMPORARY LODGING

It is advisable to locate and reserve temporary lodging in advance. Your sponsor can help you make local arrangements.

Navy Gateway Inns & Suites

The Navy Gateway Inns & Suites, located on base, provides temporary lodging for military members and their families transferring in and out of the area. Incoming personnel are authorized a temporary lodging expense of 10 days at the inn or by use of other commercial lodging within local per diem rates. The Navy Gateway Inns & Suites offers free laundry facilities and in-room kitchens. Call 912-573-4871 for more information or to make reservations.

Navy Lodge

The Navy Lodge, just inside the Jackson Gate, offers 25 rooms (one ADA compliant room). The rooms were recently renovated and include new flooring, window treatments, toilets, vanities and closet areas. Each of the rooms has a kitchen, Wi-Fi accessibility and cable/satellite TV. The lodge offers a complimentary breakfast and is a pet-friendly establishment (fees apply). To schedule a reservation, call 912-882-6868.

Hotels

There are several major chain hotels in the Camden County Kings Bay area. Accommodations are usually plentiful year-round, and your sponsor can provide a list of the hotels in the area.

WEATHER

The climate in southeast Georgia is generally temperate. Summers are long and warm with an average relative humidity of about 75 percent. Winters, although punctuated with periodic invasions of cool to occasionally cold air from the north, are mild because of the southern latitude and the proximity to the warm Atlantic Ocean waters.

The annual average temperature for the Kings Bay area is 68. June, July and August are the hottest months, with temperatures averaging above 90 degrees. December, January and

February are the coolest months, with temperatures near the mid-50s. Temperatures exceed 95 degrees during the summer months, and evening temperatures are usually comfortable, rarely falling below 75 degrees.

The greatest rainfall occurs during the summer. Summer thunderstorms usually occur before noon along the beaches, while afternoon thunderstorms are the rule inland.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Hurricane season officially runs from June 1 to Nov. 1, but tropical cyclones can form earlier or later if the conditions are right. Although it has been more than 100 years since Camden County has been directly impacted by a significant weather event, this area has had at least nine major storms within 60 nautical miles.

Hurricane is a name given to a strong tropical cyclone. Tropical cyclones with maximum sustained winds of less than 39 mph (34 knots) are called tropical depressions. Once winds reach at least 39 mph, they are typically called a tropical storm and assigned a name. If winds reach 74 mph (64 knots), they are called a hurricane.

Residents should have evacuation kits prepared prior to the season starting and should be ready to leave when a hurricane watch is issued. A watch is issued when there is a threat of hurricane conditions within 36 hours. All evacuation orders will be issued by the governor through Georgia Emergency Management Agency and Camden County Emergency Management officials. If you reside in an area where evacuation orders have been issued, you should evacuate.

Emergency shelters will open, as needed, in areas unaffected by the event. If the event is



a hurricane evacuation, then shelters will be opened in counties farther inland. Camden County will open shelters if needed after the hurricane has made landfall. Information regarding shelter locations and community resources can be found at the American Red Cross of Northeast Florida Chapter website at www.redcross.org/fl/jacksonville.

There are established evacuation routes for Camden County and the outlying areas and residents should become familiar with which route pertains to them. Georgia State Highway 40 is the westbound route for most residents in the southern part of Camden County. For those in the Woodbine area, Highway 110 south will lead them west and south to join Highway 40 west into Charlton County. Evacuees in the middle part of the county may also

take Highway 252 south and west into Charlton County. Highway 259 leads west from Tarboro into Brantley County, while Highway 110 north will take them west to Highway 82 in Brantley County. Highway 17 and Interstate 95 are north-south corridors. Additional information regarding traffic routes and preparation guides can be found at the Camden County website at www.co.camden.ga.us. The last coastal evacuation occurred in 1999 with Hurricane Floyd.

Regarding work schedules, closings and delays, Trident Training Facility employees should call 912-573-3453. Trident Refit Facility employees are to call 877-811-8078. Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic employees are to call 912-573-4110. Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay employees and all other commands are requested to monitor WKBX-FM 106.3, Florida and Georgia public radio, WJXT News 4, First Coast News, CBS 47 or Fox 30 News for updated information.

Following an evacuation, Navy personnel within the affected area and uniformed and Department of the Navy civilians are urged to muster with their commands or within the Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System (NFAAS) support website at <https://navyfamily.navy.mil>. Displaced personnel who have been ordered to evacuate by military authority can call the Navy Pay and Personnel Support Center at Norfolk, Virginia, at 866-239-0303 for evacuation travel-related questions.

REPORTING ABOARD

THE FIRST STOP

The first stop for all new personnel reporting aboard should be their appropriate command administrative department. Personnel checking aboard any of the submarines should report directly to the Naval Submarine Support Center. Personnel reporting to the submarine base, Submarine Group 10, Trident Training Facility or Trident Refit Facility should report directly to those command administrative departments.

Your administrative department will get you started on the check-in process.

If you arrive after hours, check in at your command's quarterdeck to have your original orders endorsed. Report to your respective administrative department the next workday to officially check-in. If your arrival dates or times change, or if an emergency arises that might prevent you from reporting on time, call your command and sponsor in advance or as soon as safely possible.

PERSONNEL SUPPORT ACTIVITY DETACHMENT

Military members should report to their Command Personnel Pay Administrator (CPPA) to complete the required check-in procedures and file travel claims.

Building 1052 services include identification card issue and Dependent Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) updates for military and family members, passport applications and the Educational Services Office for the Navy Wide Examination information.

All active-duty and reserve personnel must establish and maintain a self-service Electronic Service Record (ESR) account. Self-service accounts contain important features, such as enabling Sailors to directly submit PCS (permanent change of station) travel claims upon PCS transfer and update race, ethnicity, religious information and emergency contact information. The ESR replaces the paper service record as the single field-level data entry point for service record maintenance. Self-service accounts can be created at <https://nsips.nmci.navy.mil> with a military ID (CAC card).

WHAT'S AT KINGS BAY

MAJOR COMMANDS AT KINGS BAY

Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay

Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay provides support to the fleet, fighter and family by maintaining and operating the facilities of the Trident submarine force stationed here.

Submarine Group 10

Submarine Group 10 was commissioned Jan. 1, 1989, and is the senior command at Kings Bay. Group 10 is a subordinate command to Commander, Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. It exercises command over various assigned units, including operational and administrative control of the Ohio-class submarines based at Submarine Base Kings Bay.

Group 10 is the local coordinating authority for all matters assigned by the submarine force commander and exercises direct control over the administration and training of submarine off-crews at Kings Bay. Specifically included in these responsibilities is the proper integration and coordination of the facilities dedicated to training support of the Trident system.

Submarine Squadrons 16 and 20

Submarine squadrons 16 and 20 provide administrative support for the East Coast-based Ohio-class submarines. The squadron coordinates the planning and execution of all SSBN and SSGN maintenance with Trident Refit Facility and is responsible for material readiness and fiscal responsibility.

Naval Submarine Support Center

The submarine center provides centralized administrative and support services to the submarine squadron, assisting them in their responsibilities for material, personnel, training and logistics of assigned and visiting submarines.

Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic

Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic (SWFLANT) provides strategic missiles and strategic weapons system support to the ballistic-missile submarine fleet. The command is responsible for assembling the D-5 missile and processing missile guidance and launcher subsystem components. The workforce consists of engineers, administration and management personnel, supply and accounting technicians, maintenance personnel, equipment operators, and safety and quality assurance specialists. Facilities include administration buildings, supply warehouses, a calibration laboratory, missile assembly buildings, vertical missile packaging buildings, inspection buildings and explosives-handling wharves.

The D-5 has a greater range, payload and accuracy than its predecessors since it incorporates many state-of-the-art technological advances in electronics and rocketry. The D-5 is the heart of the Trident weapons system, which also includes the submarine, support equipment and shore facilities. The system is designed to be America's seaborne deterrent to strategic war.

Marine Corps Security Force Battalion

The battalion, commanded by a senior Marine Corps officer, provides physical security for SWFLANT.

Activated Sept. 1, 1987, the battalion provides security operations as approved by the chief of naval operations, in coordination with the commandant of the Marine Corps, and performs other functions as directed by the commandant.

The Naval Guard Force, comprised of Navy Masters-at-Arms, was integrated with the Marine Corps Security Force Company in 2005, reporting as one unit under the command of SWFLANT. The company was designated as a battalion in 2008.

Trident Refit Facility

Trident Refit Facility is the largest tenant command at Kings Bay and has quietly and efficiently kept a significant portion of America's submarine warfare capability at sea since 1985. TRF provides quality industrial and logistics support for the incremental overhaul, modernization and repair of Trident submarines (SSBN/SSGN) and also provides global submarine supply support. In addition, TRF provides maintenance and support services to other submarines, regional maintenance customers and other activities as requested.

The military and civilian workforce work in a variety of trades supporting submarine and ship repair and maintenance. While the bulk of the TRF workload is associated with the repair of Trident submarines, the TRF team also provides maintenance and support services to other class submarines, for both the U.S. and the U.K., regional maintenance customers and the Trident Planned Equipment Replacement program.

TRF boasts the largest covered dry dock in the Western Hemisphere. Measuring 700 feet long, 100 feet wide and 67 feet deep, the dry dock is a marvel. A state-of-the-art magnetic silencing facility (MSF) provides degaussing services, including ranging and deperming for U.S. and United Kingdom submarines. The MSF is the only facility of its kind on the East Coast and is also used for research for development of future magnetic systems.

Trident Training Facility

The Trident Training Facility, with more than 520,000 square feet of classroom and office space, trains Sailors in the skills necessary to operate and maintain the Trident submarine and its systems. TTF has an essential role in support of the Trident submarines.

The training facility is the first stop for Sailors just completing Basic Enlisted Submarine

Training and is their first exposure to technical training to be directly used in the fleet. For experienced crew members, more advanced training is available and it is mostly accomplished during the off-crew period. Enhanced computer simulation training is also conducted on equipment identical to that aboard a Trident submarine.

TTF has a military and civilian workforce that contributes special talents in the curriculum development and in fiscal and administrative areas. TTF reports to the chief of naval education and training.

Maritime Force Protection Unit

Maritime Force Protection Unit Kings Bay is a single-mission Coast Guard unit that provides escort for the SSBN fleet transiting in and out of the Kings Bay area. The unit includes the Coast Guard cutters Sea Dragon and Sea Dog and smaller patrol craft. The unit is also composed of the Military Sealift Command ships MV HOS Black Powder and Westwind.

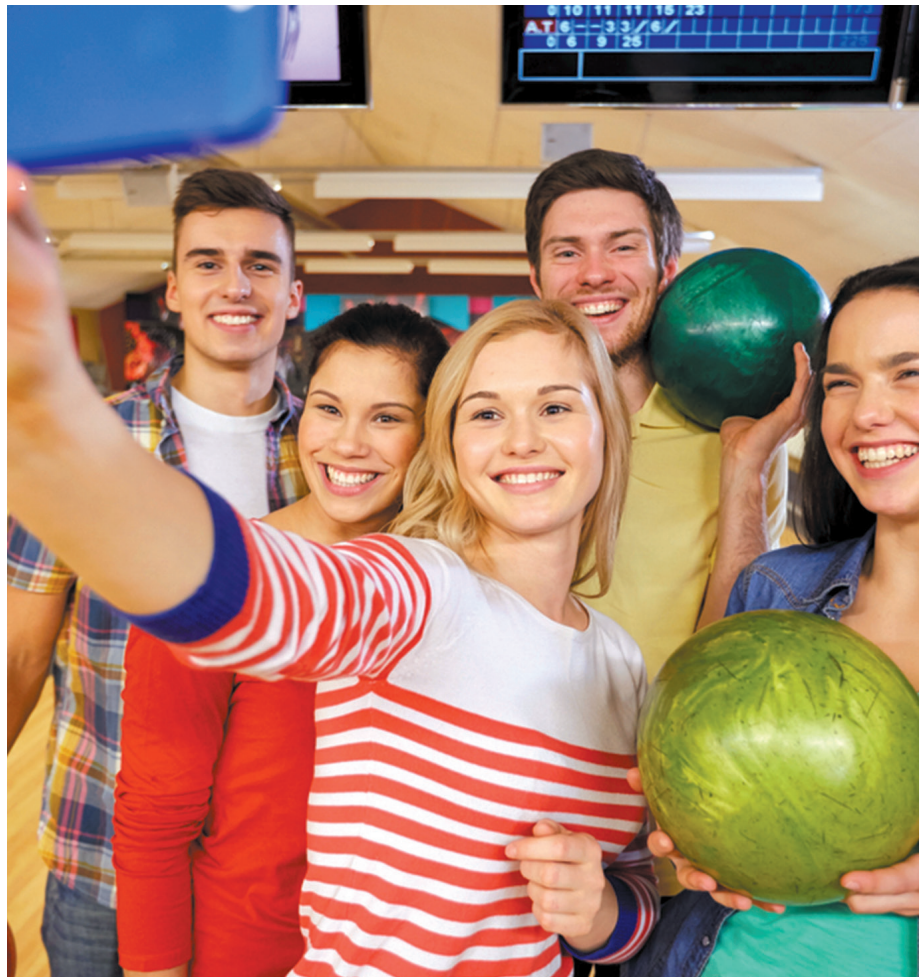

Other food services are at Trident Refit Facility's cafeteria in the administrative building, Trident Training Facility snack bar and Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic. There is also a McDonald's on base within a short walking distance from the NEX.

Main Retail Store

The main retail store carries a variety of products ranging from major appliances to clothing. It also has a special order desk, garden shop and an array of Navy Pride merchandise.

Personalized Services Shop

This specialized gift store has a variety of merchandise available, including plaques, coins, novelties, Kings Bay-specific souvenirs and military-themed clothing. Personalized Services also offers phone cards, special ordering and engraving services.



SERVICES AVAILABLE

Uniform Center and Tailoring Shop

Located inside the main retail store, the Uniform Center and Tailoring Shop boast a knowledgeable staff that can assist with all of your uniform needs, from purchase to fitting. Laundry and dry cleaning services are also available.

NAVY FEDERAL CREDIT UNION

The Kings Bay area has two full-service Navy Federal Credit Union service centers conveniently located for all members. The Kings Bay center is next to the Navy Exchange and is open 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday and 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Friday. The St. Marys center is at 560 Charlie Smith Sr. Highway (Spur 40) near the Franklin Gate. It is open 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday.

Civilian and military personnel regularly employed by the DOD who work at Kings Bay and members of their immediate families are eligible for membership at NFCU.

NFCU's direct-deposit and savings program services include share and individual retirement account certificates, share savings and share checking. Navy Federal also offers a wide variety of consumer loan products, including vehicle loans, major credit cards and home-improvement loans at competitive rates.

NFCU has 24-hour automatic teller machines available to members in the local area. ATMs on base are at the Navy Exchange, NFCU and Trident Training Facility. Off base, teller machines are conveniently located outside the St. Marys NFCU. These ATMs can be used by anyone whose financial institution is a member of the PLUS System or Interlink. NAVY-MARINE CORPS RELIEF SOCIETY

The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society (NMRCS) provides assistance to active-duty members and retired Navy and Marine Corps service members.

The society offers many services, including financial assistance for temporary hardship, budget counseling, a food locker, gift layettes of infant clothing and other basic items for newborns, referral to other military or community service organizations, a listening post for people with problems, education loan programs for family members of active-duty personnel and children of retirees, and fleet input to commissioning programs.

Financial assistance, in the form of interest-free loans when the service member can repay, is provided in emergency situations. Emergencies include:

- Basic living expenses (food, shelter and utilities).
- Emergency transportation.
- Funeral expenses.
- Emergency automobile repair.
- Medical and dental expenses.
- Individual home disasters.

These areas of assistance, while stated in general terms, are subject to some limitations and

NAVAL SECURITY DETACHMENT

The Security Detachment, manned by active-duty military, DOD civilians and contract security personnel, provides physical security and law enforcement services to Kings Bay. Kings Bay Navy Police take pride in being a “community-policing” organization and are dedicated to providing professional, progressive services to the base community.

Serving as caretakers of the community, Navy Police are committed to “proactive” versus “reactive” policing. This commitment is manifested through a wide variety of programs focused on community interaction through a highly refined crime prevention program.

Possession or transportation of privately owned firearms or weapons on base is prohibited, except for registered hunters or special events. Weapons may be kept in family housing if they are registered with Security. However, weapons cannot be kept in barracks rooms. Security is at 1115 Henry Clay Blvd., Building 2026. Call the Watch Commander at 912-573-9697 regarding storing and transporting weapons or other security issues.

POST OFFICE

The U.S. post office branch is in Building 1006, behind the Navy Exchange Autoport. This small but full-service post office provides a full range of postal needs, including international mail service. The post office is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday and closed Saturday and Sunday.

If you do not have a residence prior to transferring, you will need to forward your mail to your next command. For more information regarding change of address or setting up a post office box, call 912-573-9633. The U.S. post office also has branches in St. Marys, Kingsland and Woodbine.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The Public Affairs Office provides internal and external information, media relations and community relations.

The base public affairs officer is the official representative to the media concerning events and people associated with the base. You can direct any question or concern to the Public Affairs Office at 912-573-4714.



The PAO also directs a robust community service program with the base, tenant commands and the local community. Some of the community service programs include Personal Excellence Partnership, Project Good Neighbor, Environmental Stewardship and Health, and Safety and Fitness. SEA CADETS

The U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps, sponsored by the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard, is a federally chartered nonprofit civilian youth training organization for ages 11 through 17. Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay hosts the Kings Bay Division which is sponsored by the Camden-Kings Bay Navy League Council. During the school year, Sea Cadets attend monthly drills. During winter, spring and summer breaks, the cadets have the opportunity to attend trainings both here at Kings Bay as well as across the nation.

The goals of the program are to develop an interest and ability in seamanship, instill principles of strong moral principles, and demonstrate the value of an alcohol, drug and gang-free lifestyle. Sea Cadets are also exposed to the prestige of a military career while learning to be leaders in all aspects of their lives.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

There are four main sources of employment at Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay:

1. Federal service positions with Naval Submarine Base or tenant commands.
2. Nonappropriated fund positions with MWR, Navy Exchange or DeCA.
3. The base operating services contractor, VT Griffin, provides base security, firefighting, maintenance of buildings and grounds, and minor construction work.
4. Defense contractors on the base. Employment opportunities should be pursued either directly with the company or with the Georgia Department of Labor.

Recruitment for federal service positions at Kings Bay is processed through the Human Resources Service Center Southeast. Federal

BANCROFT SAIL EXHIBIT

Other U.S. military bases may have ceremonial tanks or aircraft at their front gates, but Kings Bay has a submarine greeting visitors at the entrance to the 16,000-acre naval base located in Coastal Georgia. Rising from a sea of green grass at the Franklin Gate is the USS George Bancroft Sail Exhibit, a display commemorating the Navy's submarine program.

USS George Bancroft (SSBN 643), commissioned Jan. 22, 1966, in Groton, Connecticut, served in the Navy's submarine service for more than 27 years. With the advent of the Ohio-class submarines and the end of the Cold War, the older Franklin-class submarines were no longer needed and Bancroft was decommissioned and struck from the Navy list Sept. 21, 1993.

Bancroft ended up in the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Washington for scrapping and recycling in March 1998. However, Bancroft would not go away easily.

Alerted to its imminent destruction, a grassroots effort by the St. Marys Submarine

Museum, a local submarine veteran's organization, former Bancroft crew members and local businesses raised the necessary funding to bring the submarine's sail to Kings Bay and to construct the exhibit.

Saved from the recycling bin in 1998, the sail display was constructed and built as the centerpiece for Kings Bay's celebration of the submarine forces' 100th anniversary April 7, 2000.

Between October 1999 and March 2000, members of Construction Battalion Unit 412 cleared and grubbed 500 tons of soil and trees to construct the footings, foundation and lighting necessary for the exhibit. The Seabees molded the earth to resemble a submarine hull, allowing a contractor to then spray the earthen hull with a thick coat of black gunite.

The exhibit is located directly in front of the Franklin entrance to Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay at the intersection of St. Marys Road and Georgia State Highway Spur 40. The exhibit is free and open to the public.

COMMUNITIES

CAMDEN COUNTY AT A GLANCE

Geographic Location

Home to Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay, Camden County, deep in the heart of southeast Georgia, is named for the earl of Camden, Charles Pratt, who was chief justice and lord chancellor of England in the late 1700s. The county is about 40 miles from Jacksonville, Florida; 38 miles from Brunswick, Georgia; 109 miles from Savannah, Georgia; and 300 miles from Atlanta.

Land Area

As one of the largest counties in the state of Georgia, Camden County covers more than 600 square miles.

Population

The population of Camden County is more than 53,000 according to 2018 U.S. Census estimates. Due to Camden's strong economy, steady growth is predicted for the future.

Transportation

Camden County is easily accessible, Interstate 95, U.S. Highway 17 and Georgia Highway 40 all intersect the county.

Jacksonville International Airport is the nearest commercial airport serving Camden County. It is about 30 minutes south on Interstate 95.

St. Marys Municipal Airport and Brunswick Golden Isles Airport also serve the local area.

Conference Spaces and Accommodations

There are hotels, motels and bed-and-breakfast inns located in the Camden County and Kings Bay area.

Camden County has several different meeting spaces available for use by the public. For a full list of conference spaces and local accommodations, search the Camden County Chamber of Commerce's business directory at www.camdenchamber.com/list.

Government

Camden County consists of three municipalities: Woodbine, Kingsland and St. Marys. Each of these municipalities has a mayor and a council of up to six people. A county commission and a county administrator govern the county.

Law Enforcement

St. Marys and Kingsland provide law enforcement services for their residents, while Camden County provides countywide services, including service to the city of Woodbine.

Support Services and Public Safety

Camden County is served by fire departments in St. Marys, Kingsland and Woodbine staffed by full-time firefighters, emergency medical technicians and volunteers.

Health Care

Southeast Georgia Health System, Camden Campus, 2000 Dan Proctor Drive in St. Marys, offers 24-hour emergency service and full



medical care. In addition, there is a Veterans Affairs clinic as well as physicians and dentists who participate in the TRICARE system within the county.

Financial Institutions

Camden County has several financial institutions. These institutions include The Heritage Bank, Citizens State Bank, Coastal Bank of Georgia, Ameris, Southeastern Bank, United 1st Federal Credit Union and Navy Federal Credit Union.

Education

Camden County School district includes one high school, two middle schools and nine elementary schools. Alternative and Christian school options are also available.

Coastal Georgia College, a Georgia university system school, offers bachelor's and associate programs. There are several other colleges and universities within commuting distance in Brunswick, Georgia, and Jacksonville, Florida.

The county library facilities include the Camden County Public Library, St. Marys Public Library and Woodbine's Bryan-Lang Historical Library.

Communication

The newspaper that serves Camden County is The Tribune & Georgian. WECC (89.3 FM), WKBX (106.3 FM), and WWIO (88.9 FM) and WKXC (99.5 FM) also provide local news and music to the community. Jacksonville provides local broadcast of all major television networks. Comcast is the cable provider for St. Marys, Kings Bay and Woodbine while King-sland Cable provides service to Kingsland. TDS Telecom is the sole landline telephone service, while there are several major wireless carriers who serve the area.

**LOCAL COMMUNITIES
St. Marys**

St. Marys, the nearest community to the base, is the largest city in Camden County. A quaint, serene and friendly river town perched on Buttermilk Bluff, it was first settled by the Spanish well before James Oglethorpe and the English

settlers arrived. It has served as the location of an Indian village, colonial settlement and most recently, host to the Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay family. One of the oldest towns in Georgia, it boasts a national historic district and functions as the embarkation point for the Cumberland Island National Seashore.

Park your car and stroll along the city's chamber of commerce-sponsored Osborne Street, shaded by ancient live oak and palm trees. White picket fences surround many of the historic landmarks. Flowered walkways invite you to come rock for a spell on one of the many sea-breezed verandas. Gift and antique shops housed in turn-of-the-century buildings offer hours of browsing. Enjoy delicious seafood and other excellent cuisine found in the eateries of St. Marys.

Stay for a while in a historic hotel, one of the bed-and-breakfasts or locally owned family hotels. From most of the accommodations, you can walk to the pedestrian ferry for a 45-minute boat ride to Cumberland Island, where wild horses, white sand beaches and natural, unspoiled habitat are waiting to greet you.

Kingsland

Kingsland has its origins in the John Madison King Plantation in Longwood. The plantation was worked steadily by succeeding generations of Kings until the late 1800s. Called "King's



Land" rather than its proper title, businesses and private citizens began to purchase parcels of the plantation. By 1894, Longwood Plantation evolved into the town of Kingsland.

Today, Kingsland serves as home to Camden County High School, as well as several elementary schools, a middle school and churches of all major denominations. Recreation facilities include an 18-hole golf course designed by Davis Love III and the county recreation center located behind the high school on Wildcat Drive.

A great number of visitors and retirees enjoy Kingsland so much they decide to settle down to take advantage of all the wonders of the area in a climate that is pleasant year-round. In addition, Kingsland offers unparalleled opportunities for any company that requires a quality labor base, easy access to transportation or a built-in community of potential customers with relatively high disposable income.

Woodbine

Woodbine, the county seat, is the third city to be selected for that honor. Chosen in 1923 to be the seat of county government, Woodbine boasts a late Gothic Revival-style courthouse, built in 1928. This hub of county government is situated on the banks of the Satilla River, approximately 18 miles from the base.

Brunswick

Brunswick is less than one hour's drive to the north of the base and is a busy industrial center and port city. It is the gateway to the Golden Isles of Georgia (Jekyll, St. Simons and Sea islands) and has spectacular views of the Glynn County marshes. Lanier's Oak overlooks the marshes just north of Brunswick. The Georgian poet Sidney Lanier was inspired to write many poems on Coastal Georgia while sitting under this tree. Brunswick is also the home to the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, which occupies the former site of Naval Air Station Glynco.

Savannah

Georgia's oldest city is about two hours north of Kings Bay. Much of the colonial charm of





this area is preserved in the splendid architectural restorations that have been done throughout the city. Cobblestone streets wind in and out of the picturesque squares.

Many famous seafood restaurants in Savannah remind the visitor of the city's proximity to the ocean. The historic waterfront district has been restored and is now a 4-mile concourse of museums, boutiques, restaurants and nightspots that echo old-world charm along the Savannah River. Savannah is also home to the second-largest St. Patrick's Day celebration in the country.

Fernandina Beach

Fernandina Beach is about 45 minutes southeast of the base on the northern tip of Amelia Island, Florida. Called the "Isle of Eight Flags," Amelia Island has been governed by France, Spain, Great Britain, independent patriots, Florida, Mexico, the United States and the Confederacy. Fernandina, the Old Town Fernandina historic district, the plaza around the site of old Fort San Carlos, Fort Clinch State Park and many nearby places are enjoyed by residents and visitors alike.

Centre Street, in Fernandina Beach, is at the heart of the historic district that is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. A great deal of restoration has taken place, making the street a reminder of late 19th century Victoriana. The 13-mile beach at Fernandina provides unlimited swimming, surfing and sunbathing.

Fort Clinch offers excellent opportunities for camping, beachcombing and general outdoor recreation.

Fernandina Beach's docks are the sites where the first offshore trawlers sailed out in the early 20th century to begin a multimillion-dollar shrimping industry, an occasion celebrated each year on the first weekend in May with the Isle of Eight Flags Shrimp Festival. The celebration includes a shrimp boat decoration competition, a pirate parade, sidewalk arts and crafts and, of course, seafood.



Jacksonville, Florida

About a one-hour drive to the south of Kings Bay, Jacksonville is one of the largest cities in land area in the United States and has a population of nearly 904,000 people. The city has a variety of activities. The international airport, just off Interstate 95 about halfway between downtown and the base, is served by most major airlines. Jacksonville is the commercial, financial, cultural, medical and urban heart of northeast Florida and the First Coast.

Situated in the northeast corner of Florida, Jacksonville spans both banks of the broad, north-flowing St. Johns River just before it meets one of Florida's finest beaches at the Atlantic Ocean. The area includes more than 35 miles of sandy white beaches, more than

50 excellent golf courses, including the Stadium Course at Sawgrass, home of the legendary 17th hole, beautiful state parks, and luxurious spas and resorts.

Dubbed the "Bold New City," it is also a city with more than its share of history. In pre-Columbian times, the Timucuan Indians, who lived along its creeks and waterways, inhabited the area. The Spanish, led by Ponce de Leon, came next and were followed by the French in 1564. The French built Fort Caroline and established the first European colony in America. They soon lost the foothold in Florida to the Spanish, who destroyed the French fort and built a flourishing settlement in nearby St. Augustine.

In addition to its historic sites, Jacksonville is home to Naval Air Station Jacksonville and Naval Station Mayport.

ENTERTAINMENT AND PASTIMES

Camden County residents enjoy participating in the numerous leisure activities provided by the county's recreation center and a number of parks conveniently located throughout the community. Other popular pastimes include golfing, fishing, boating, camping, roller-skating and theater.

St. Marys Submarine Museum presents a fascinating walk through the history of submarines and the men who operated them. The museum is a great place to learn about the "Silent Service." A wide variety of artifacts, memorabilia and information are available for viewing and you can check out the beautiful St. Marys waterfront through a real periscope. For hours of operation and entry fees, call 912-882-2782.

The Cumberland Island National Seashore Museum is on Osborne Street, not far from the waterfront. The museum houses a collection of artifacts from Cumberland Island open to the public. The exhibition highlights the lives of Native Americans, African-Americans and the Carnegie family, as well as others who lived on the island in the 19th and 20th centuries. The museum also includes an exhibit of the "Forgotten Invasion," now recognized as one of the last battles of the War of 1812. The exhibit includes reproductions of British and American uniforms, complete with weapons, a video about the history of Point Peter and the



archaeological investigations, a children's area and a wide sampling of artifacts.

Established in 1788, Oak Grove Cemetery is literally a "who's who" of Camden County history. Located in downtown St. Marys under a canopy of live oaks, early settlers, victims of the Yellow Fever epidemic, Acadians and soldiers from the revolution to the present have been laid to rest here.

Orange Hall, completed in 1830, is considered a perfect example of Greek Revival architecture. John Wood built the home as a wedding present to his daughter Jane Wood Pratt and husband Rev. Horace Pratt. Pratt was the first minister of the Presbyterian church

located directly across the street from Orange Hall. However, both John Wood and Jane died in 1829 before the completion of the home. Pratt lived in Orange Hall until 1839 when he moved with his second wife to Alabama. The home remained in the Pratt family until it was sold in 1846. Orange Hall changed ownership several times until 1960 when it was deeded to the city of St. Marys, and was eventually placed on the National Register of Historic Homes in 1973.

First Presbyterian Church was built in 1808 and is the second-oldest church in Georgia. Other 19th century churches in historic St. Marys include Our Lady Star of the Sea Catholic Church (1847), Christ Episcopal (1880) and St. Marys Methodist Chapel (1858).

McIntosh Sugar Works, built in 1825, was a successful family enterprise and was later used as a starch factory during the Civil War. Only the tabby walls remain today, but the story is another intriguing part of Camden County's rich history. The sugar works is on Charlie Smith Sr. Highway (Spur 40), near the Stimson Gate entrance to the base.

Crooked River State Park encompasses 500 acres on the south bank of the Crooked River. The park offers a wide range of excellent facilities, including a boat ramp, camping and RV sites, cottages and picnic shelters. Call the park for more information at 912-882-5256.

Cumberland Island National Seashore is the largest and southernmost barrier





island in Georgia, offering guests more than 17 miles of secluded, white sand beaches. Visit the Greyfield Inn, built in 1901 as a vacation cottage for the Carnegie family. Converted in the 1960s to an inn, it retains the early 20th century furnishings. A short ferry ride from St. Marys transports you to this unspoiled national seashore. Walk along the pristine white sand beaches or inland through Live Oak and Palmetto forests. Deer, mink, turkey and wild horses roam freely throughout the area. Overnight camping, fishing, hiking and swimming are some of the available activities. Call 912-882-4336 for more information about Cumberland Island National Seashore.

Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge is a scenic 45-minute drive from St. Marys. Covering more than 400,000 acres, the swamp offers a rare glimpse into prehistoric times. Walk through an authentic pioneer settlement from the 1800s. Interpretive exhibits, lectures, wildlife observation, boat tours and canoe rentals are also available.

Jacksonville's museums include the Cummer Museum of Art and Gardens, the Museum of Contemporary Art, the Museum of Science & History and the Bryan-Gooding Planetarium (originally known as the Alexander Brest Planetarium). The city has one of the oldest continuously producing community theaters in the country, while universities and colleges have their own drama departments and programs.

The Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra performs concerts to packed houses throughout the year. An annual arts festival in the streets of downtown Jacksonville features the finest in arts and crafts. The Jacksonville Jazz Festival is held annually in downtown Jacksonville and features jazz performances and competitions.

Coastal Georgia and the First Coast are also home to many festivals celebrated throughout the year, such as the Mardi Gras festival, held every February in St. Marys. Woodbine celebrates the Crawfish Festival in April and in Fernandina Beach, the Blessing of the Fleet and Shrimp Festival occur in May.

St. Marys also observes the Fourth of July with a parade, arts and crafts displays, and street dancing. The Kingsland Catfish Festival is held over the Labor Day weekend and is followed by the St. Marys Rock Shrimp Festival in October. Christmas throughout the community is celebrated with tree lightings and parades.
