Our Military

in Houston County

ROBINS AIR FORCE BASE is in the geographic heart of Georgia, largest state east of the Mississippi River. Atlanta, the state capital, lies about 100 miles north on Interstate 75, and Florida is four hours south on the interstate. Macon, "Cherry-Blossom Capital of the World" and Georgia's fourth-largest city, is 15 miles north of the base. Interstate 16 intersects with I-75 in Macon and leads to Savannah, the Atlantic Ocean and the Golden Isles.

Robins AFB is the largest industrial complex in Georgia. The base covers more than 6,934 acres and contains more than 14 million square feet of facilities. It also has Georgia's longest runway: 12,000 feet long by 300 feet wide with two 1,000-foot overruns.

Robins Air Force Base is home to multiple missions under multiple commands, all working together to defend America. Major units include the 78th Air Base Wing, the Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex and the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center. The base is also home to many associate units, including the Air Force Reserve Command, the 116th and 461st air control wings, and the Defense Logistics Agency. Population

In fiscal 2018, personnel at Robins AFB included 6,151 military members, 14,284 appropriated fund civilians and 2,791 employees who were funded by other sources.

Economic Impact

Robins AFB's total annual economic impact on Georgia in fiscal 2018 was approximately \$3.15 billion. It created about \$1.2 billion in jobs.

HISTORY

When on June 14, 1941, the War Department officially approved building an Army air depot in Georgia, leadership considered it part of a long-range plan to prepare American defenses in case of war. Instead, the Japanese bombing of Pearl Harbor precipitated immediate construction of this vital installation, what eventually became Robins Air Force Base, named after Brig. Gen. Augustine Warner Robins. Robins was one of the Army Air Corps' first general staff officers and commander of the Fairfield Air Intermediate Depot, Ohio, from 1921 to 1928; deputy commander of the Materiel Division, Wright Field, Ohio, from 1931 to 1933; and commander at Wright Field from 1935 to 1939. His principal interest throughout his career was air-based combat logistics, and he is considered the Air Force's Father of Logistics.

Construction officially started on the new Georgia Air Depot, 16 miles south of Macon, on Sept. 1, 1941. Bordered by the Ocmulgee River on the east and the sleepy little Southern Railroad whistle-stop of Wellston on the west, the flat former dairy farm had begun its transformation into what is today the largest industrial installation in Georgia.

Known early on as the Georgia Air Depot, it was redesignated as the Southeast Air Depot, Wellston Air Depot, Wellston Army Air Depot, Warner Robins Army Air Depot, Warner Robins *Continued on Page 8*

Air Depot Control Area Command, Warner Robins Air Service Command and Warner Robins Air Technical Services Command during World War II.

At the end of war, as its function changed and satellite bases closed, the name altered again to the Warner Robins Air Materiel Area. In April 1974, new worldwide responsibilities led to its renaming as the Warner Robins Air Logistics Center, which was deactivated in July 2012, then immediately activated as Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex.

Today, the WR-ALC and Robins AFB are the state's largest industrial facility. Throughout its existence, the center's mission and responsibility have been the supply of parts for maintenance, repair and storage of aircraft vital to the nation's defense. The major change in this mission has been the enormity of its growth and its technical complexity. In World War II, personnel at Robins AFB maintained warplanes as well as trained and dispatched more than a quartermillion maintenance, supply and logistics field team members to every theater of war.

After World War II, the number of military and civilian employees dropped dramatically until by March 1946, it had fallen to 3,900. However, the critical role that Robins AFB and its repair and supply personnel played in the Berlin Airlift (Operation Vittles) from 1948 to 1949 swelled its workforce to 11,000. Growth continued with the advent of the Korean War.

Once again the nation took notice of the essential role of the depot — then known as the Warner Robins Air Materiel Area. In one of their finest efforts, workers at the center literally unwrapped and refurbished hundreds of "cocooned" Boeing B-29 Superfortresses. Understaffed and working around the clock, they made sure that United Nations forces in the Far East had the tools they needed to fight the North Korean invaders of South Korea. The U.S. B-29s proved to be key in bombing Communist supply lines and staving off the enemy's assault on allied forces pinned down inside the Pusan Perimeter.

The lesson of Korea was not lost on Washington policymakers. Ever since, both the Air Force and Department of Defense have always ensured that Robins AFB is adequately staffed. Robins AFB and the WR-ALC played major parts in the Vietnam War through the resupply of troops and materiels known as the Southeast Asian Pipeline.

In 1990 and 1991, Desert Shield and Desert Storm once again challenged the WR-ALC and Robins AFB workforce to provide supplies, parts, repairs and personnel to coalition forces in the Persian Gulf, wresting Kuwait from Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein's occupying forces. Personnel at Robins and throughout the Air



Force airlifted more supplies and aircraft to the Persian Gulf theater of war in 14 weeks than the Allies had airlifted in 14 months to West Berlin during the Berlin Airlift.

Robins AFB, like all U.S. military installations, was deeply affected by the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11. 2001. The base took up its role in the global war on terrorism, surging repair materials and spares and pushing forward sustainment and support operations for U.S. forces in harm's way.

Between Oct. 7, 2001, and March 18, 2002, Robins AFB personnel performed remarkable service for allied forces during Operation Enduring Freedom, the liberation of Afghanistan. This performance continued during Operation Iraqi Freedom from March 19 to May 1, 2003, as allied forces destroyed the regime of Saddam Hussein.

Since that time, Afghan and Iraqi rebuilding efforts have also been supported by the men and women of Robins AFB. Even after Hussein's capture, underground resistance has continued in both nations. However, the U.S. has remained determined to complete its nation-building effort, and Robins has continued its crucial contributions to this cause.

ORGANIZATIONS 78TH AIR BASE WING

The wing has been supporting combat operations for more than 60 years. The base has incredible diversity in missions, ranging from operational flying wings to specialized support services. The wing is composed of four groups.

The 78th Mission Support Group manages and directs essential base operating support functions, which enable effective command, control and communications; law enforcement; security; civilian and military personnel; education services; family services; information management; child care and youth activities; community activities; lodging; fitness; food services; and mortuary affairs. The group provides base-level management of key logistics support and infrastructure to include vehicle management, supply fuels, and contingency planning and execution.

The 78th Air Base Wing Communications Directorate employs information technologies to enable the center to enhance war-fighter capabilities.

The 78th Civil Engineer Group is responsible for providing, operating, maintaining, restoring and protecting the managed assets of the Robins infrastructure and facilities, including environmental stewardship, real estate management, comprehensive and space management, energy and utility systems, roads and grounds, military family housing, facility maintenance and





repair in-house and by contract, fire emergency services, and readiness and emergency management services.

The 78th Medical Group provides health care services for more than 47,000 military and civilian personnel.

HEADQUARTERS, AIR FORCE RESERVE COMMAND

Headquarters, Air Force Reserve Command manages the service's nearly 75,000 Reserve forces, which are involved in every mission of the Active Component, from communications and services to space and flight testing and mobility operations. It also oversees two DOD missions unique to the AFRC: the fixed-wing spray missions to kill mosquitoes after a natural disaster and the Hurricane Hunters unit at Keesler AFB, which monitors hurricanes for the National Weather Service.

WARNER ROBINS **AIR LOGISTICS COMPLEX**

The WR-ALC provides depot maintenance, engineering support and software development to major weapon systems (F-15, C-5, C-130, C-17 and Special Operations Forces aircraft). The complex achieves command objectives providing a capability and capacity to support peacetime maintenance requirements, wartime emergency demands, aircraft battle damage repair and a ready source of maintenance of critical items.

116TH AND 461ST AIR CONTROL WINGS (TEAM JSTARS)

The 116th and 461st Air Control Wings -Georgia Air National Guard and active-duty wings, respectively - operate the Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System, the most advanced ground surveillance and battle management system in the world and the only capability of its type in the Department of Defense. Team JSTARS routinely supports combatant commanders in at least six geographic regions of the world.

5TH COMBAT COMMUNICATIONS GROUP

The 5th Combat Communications Group provides rapidly deployable communications cpabilities in permissive and non-permissive contingency environments around the globe. It specializes in training, deploying and delivering personnel and equipment to meet combat and humanitarian operation needs.

638TH SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT GROUP

The 638th Supply Chain Management Group provides life cycle sustainment support for aircraft structural, communications, armament and electronic commodities. It employs specialists who manage a catalogue of more than 89,000 repairable and manufactured items.

DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY – DLA AVIATION & DLA DISTRIBUTION

DLA activities at Robins include DLA Aviation, which provides logistical support to the Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex; DLA Distribution, which oversees a major warehousing operation on base that serves both onbase and worldwide customers; DLA Disposition Services, which has regional responsibilities for demilitarization, hazard waste disposal, precious metal recovery and reuse or disposition of military items; and DLA Document Services, which provides reprographic, design and digitization services.

AIR FORCE LIFE CYCLE MANAGEMENT CENTER

The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center is the single center responsible for total life cycle management of Air Force weapon systems. The center was activated in 2012 when the Air Force Materiel Command transitioned from 12 to five centers (a sixth center stood up in 2014). Key goals of the center are to improve weapon system acquisition and product support, simplify and reduce overhead structure, and eliminate redundancies by consolidating staff functions and

processes. The center provides oversight of most program office personnel previously aligned in aerospace sustainment directorates at the former Air Logistics Centers at Robins Air Force Base; Hill Air Force Base, Utah; and Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma.

ARRIVAL



Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport has shuttle service to the base. Visit the airport's website, www.atl. com, for more information. SPONSORSHIP

Contact your sponsor with your estimated arrival time and flight information, if applicable, prior to your arrival at Robins Air Force Base.

DOCUMENTS TO CARRY FOR INPROCESSING

- · Several copies of your orders.
- Certified copies of birth certificates, adoption papers, naturalization papers, marriage license, divorce papers, etc.
- Copy of advanced pay or allowance paperwork.
- All moving paperwork including TMO information, self-move paperwork and all receipts associated with moving.
- Employment records or resumes of civilian family members.
- Medical and dental records of your entire family from your previous duty station.
- Immunization records for all children, activeduty members and pets.
- School records and transcripts for students.
- Copies of all insurance policies.
- Copies of all occupational licenses and certifications.
- Purchase agreements for vehicles, showing state sales tax paid.
- Vehicle registrations and titles.
- Household goods inventory.
- Letters of credit from utility companies.
- Copies of federal income tax forms.
- Copies of recent leave and earnings statements.



Sponsorship is vital to the relocation process. Don't PCS without talking to your sponsor before departing for Robins Air Force Base. Your sponsor will answer any questions you have about the base and the local area, make lodging or dorm arrangements and meet you upon arrival. Your sponsor will be there to help you and your family until you are settled into your new community.

If you have not been in touch with a sponsor and your departure is nearing, contact your gaining unit or call the Military Personnel Section at 478-222-6862.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

Cellphone use by the driver of a moving motor vehicle is prohibited on all Department of Defense installations, unless the cellphone is used with a hands-free device.

From Middle Georgia Regional Airport

Robins AFB is approximately 10 miles south of Middle Georgia Regional Airport. From the airport, take Georgia Highway 247 south to Gate 1 on Green Street.

From Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport

Follow Interstate 75 south for about 79 miles to Georgia Highway 247 south. Take Georgia Highway 247 south for about 12 miles to Gate 1 on Green Street.

From Interstate 75

Newcomers who arrive in their vehicles will more than likely be traveling on Interstate 75. Take Exit 146 to Georgia Highway 247 Connector, also called Centerville/Watson Boulevard (east), to the main gate (Gate 3), approximately 5.8 miles. Or you can take Exit 144 to Russell Parkway (east), which will take you directly to the rear of the base (about 10 miles).

CHECK-IN PROCEDURES

Military members entering Gate 3, open 24/7, will be directed during duty hours to the INTRO Office, in Building 767, or to the 24-hour arrival point at Pine Oaks Lodging, in Building 557. The first full duty day after arrival, your sponsor will take you to your unit's orderly room, which will schedule an appointment for inprocessing. Bring all hand-carried records with you for inprocessing.

Civilians assigned to Robins AFB should report to their assigned command support staff office. For more information, visit the Civilian Personnel Office, Building 376. Contact the office at 478-222-0601.

You will need to take two copies of your orders to your current finance office no earlier than 30 days prior to your outprocessing so your financial records can be updated for your PCS move. Your finance office will also brief you on your authorized PCS financial entitlements to include BAS, BAH, direct deposit, advance pay, per diem, mileage, dislocation allowance and temporary lodging expense. It is important to keep all receipts for filing your travel voucher upon arrival. If you have any questions, contact your serving finance office to assist you with any PCS entitlements. Note: You must receive concurrent travel approval from the gaining commander when bringing family members to the new duty station.

If you get married before you PCS, you must inform your commander and follow the procedures exactly as instructed. The military will not pay for your spouse's travel and housing if you do not follow proper procedures.

TEMPORARY LODGING

Pine Oaks Lodging

Pine Oaks Lodging provides safe, comfortable and clean accommodations for military members and their families who are being assigned to Robins AFB. Pet-friendly units are available. Amenities include free Wi-Fi, cable TV, coffee makers, microwaves and refrigerators. Check the website for more information.

The 78th Medical Group provides medical, dental and public health services for people assigned to Robins AFB, their families and retirees. The group provides care in flight medicine, family health, mental health, dental health, optometry, pediatrics, physical therapy and more. Hours vary by clinic; call for current hours of operation.

There is no on-base emergency room. Those who have an emergency should go to the Houston Medical Center emergency room at 1601 Watson Blvd. in Warner Robins or the nearest emergency room. Patients are asked to contact their primary care manager within one duty day to report any care received at an emergency room to ensure proper follow-up.

The Fast Forward clinic, in Building 49 on the flight line, provides preventive health education, acute care or care for workplace injuries, work-related rehabilitation for musculoskeletal conditions (such as back and shoulder injuries), medical exams, follow-up injury care and aftercare conditioning programs. The centralized location allows employees who work in industrial areas of the Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex access to health professionals, within a few minutes' walk from most worksites. For more information, call 478-468-2038.

Dental care for beneficiaries is extremely limited, except for after-hours emergency dental care for acute problems such as uncontrolled



pain, swelling or trauma. Family members of active-duty personnel are encouraged to use the TRICARE Dental Program. Program information is available by visiting www.tricare.mil/ CoveredServices/Dental/TDP.

HOUSING

Housing Management Office

The Robins AFB Housing Management Office is ready to support you in your transition to your new home and community. Use its resources to become familiar with your housing options and available support services. When you arrive at Robins AFB, visit the HMO for invaluable information, counseling and guidance before you sign any written lease or sales contract for housing.

Unaccompanied Housing

Unaccompanied housing is provided for unaccompanied airmen in the ranks of E-1 to E-3, and E-4 with less than three years of service. Each airman is provided a private sleeping room, furnishings, bed linens and supplies required for comfortable living. Permanent-party unaccompanied housing consists of private rooms and shared bathrooms. Amenities include plentiful parking, a walking and biking trail, grills and picnic tables, a lighted basketball court and a sand volleyball court. The dining facility is conveniently located in the center of the campus.

Unaccompanied airmen in the rank of E-4 with more than three years of service will move into housing in the local community.

The Robins veterinary treatment facility is professionally staffed by personnel with the primary mission of providing complete veterinary care for all government-owned animals. Though it also offers many types of routine care services for pets of military families, most pet emergencies are best handled by a full-service civilian veterinary hospital; see the Military Buyer's Guide tab to connect with local veterinarians.

Services include preventive medicine and vaccinations, health certificates for interstate and international travel, microchip ID systems, shots, over-the-counter flea and tick medication, heartworm treatments and more. Call to make an appointment or for more information.

All pets living on base must be registered with the facility upon arrival. On-base housing limits the number and breed of pets that can live in on-base housing.

Vehicles don't have to be registered with Robins AFB, but every privately owned vehicle on base must be insured and have a current license plate. Georgia state traffic laws apply on base; see the Getting To & Around Houston County chapter on Page XY for more information. All vehicles entering or leaving base are subject to search.

Welcome

to Houston County

ONE OF THE MOST rapidly growing communities in middle Georgia, Houston County (pronounced "Howston") has a population of more than 155,000, covers nearly 400 square miles and has three incorporated cities: Centerville, Perry and Warner Robins.

Residents enjoy direct access to Interstate 75, and Interstate 16 is less than 20 miles to the east. The county has a general aviation airport and Atlanta's international airport, Hartsfield-Jackson Airport, is easily accessed 100 miles to the north.

Houston County is home to nationally acclaimed public and private school systems as well as several colleges and universities. The county's public school system has been recognized by both the Georgia Schools of Excellence and National Schools of Excellence programs.

Comprehensive health care is readily accessible to residents at local facilities that offer the latest in medical technology. Outdoor recreational opportunities abound, and mountains and seacoasts are a quick road trip away. Last but not least, you'll find ample Southern hospitality and charm in Houston County to welcome you to your new community.

HISTORY

Houston County, named in honor of Georgia Gov. John Houstoun, was created in 1821 through a treaty signed with the Creek Indians. Perry, the county seat and geographic center of the state of Georgia, was incorporated in 1824 as Houston County's first official town.

Originally, Houston was just one of five huge counties but would lose land when Bibb, Crawford, DeKalb, Pike, Macon and Peach counties were formed later.

Many of the early settlers were land lottery winners. They came from the Georgia coast, Virginia and the Carolinas to take advantage of Houston County's rich, sandy loam and grew vegetables, wheat and potatoes. Exports of cotton via the Ocmulgee River supported plantations in the area, and by 1889, Houston was the largest peach-growing county in the U.S. In the 1920s, Houston County went through spurts of development with the establishment of the Clinchfield Cement Plant that took advantage of rich local deposits of limestone and kaolin and with a prosperous lumber industry clearing the abundant yellow pine.

The county's largest city, Warner Robins, was incorporated in 1943 after Robins Air Force Base was established during World War II. Both the city and the base are named after Brig. Gen. Augustine Warner Robins.

The city of Centerville was incorporated in 1958.

Today, Robins AFB drives much of the economy in middle Georgia.

SAFETY

State Patrol, Capitol Police and the Motor Carrier Compliance Division. The Georgia State Patrol is responsible for enforcing traffic and criminal laws and investigating traffic crashes. The Motor Carrier Compliance Division conducts safety inspections of commercial motor vehicles and inspects highway hazmat shipments.

WEATHER AND CLIMATE

Houston County has a mild, warm climate that allows residents to enjoy Georgia's many outdoor recreation options year-round. Each season is distinct, but temperatures and conditions can be enjoyable in all of them.

In summer, the average high temperature is typically in the 90s, with average lows of 60 to 70 degrees. Winter days see highs between 50 and 60 degrees with nighttime lows in the 30s. Houston County receives 45 to 50 inches of precipitation throughout the year, with March usually the rainiest month.

Local Hazards

Every second counts in a natural disaster so planning and preparation can be lifesavers. Ready Georgia is a statewide campaign supported by the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency aimed at motivating Georgians to take action to prepare for a disaster. Major east-west state routes include state Route 247, to Warner Robins, state Route 96 with access to Bonaire, and state Route 11 to Perry.

Centerville

Located halfway between Byron and Wellston and halfway between Macon and Perry — hence its name — Centerville was incorporated in 1958. One of the youngest cities in Georgia, Centerville has a population of about 7,700.

A family-friendly town, Centerville is part of a fast-growing area of Georgia. The Houston County Galleria, on Watson Boulevard, offers shoppers more than 40 specialty shops to choose from, along with a 15-screen cinema. Residents also enjoy many nearby annual festivals and events, such as the International Cherry Blossom Festival in Macon and the Georgia National Fair in Perry.

Those looking to make their home in Centerville can choose from a wide selection of real estate. Median rent is \$1,018, and selected monthly owner costs of housing units with a mortgage are \$1,371. Mean travel time to work for those living in Centerville is about 22 minutes.

Perry

Situated at the intersection of four highways, Perry is known as the "Crossroads of Georgia."





The prime location makes Perry an inviting place for travelers, and tourism is one of the city's top industries. Named after Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry (the "Hero of Lake Erie" in the War of 1812), the city was incorporated in 1824 and is the county seat of Houston County. The city's population is about 17,300.

Perry is famous for the Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter. The facility sits on more than 1,100 acres and hosts the state fair along with hundreds of other events. Perry's historic downtown area is filled with specialty shops, a community theater and historic landmarks. Fairs and festivals, such as the annual Dogwood Festival, showcase the city's Southern pride and beauty.

Real estate in Perry is diverse. Median rent is \$810, and selected monthly owner costs of housing units with a mortgage are \$1,188. Mean travel time to work for those living in Perry is around 21 minutes.

Warner Robins

Warner Robins is diverse, prompting its slogan "Georgia's International City," and has a growing population of nearly 76,000. A U.S. Air Force military depot was established in the small farming community — then known as Wellston — in 1941. Soon after, both the depot and town were renamed after one of the Air Corps' first logisticians, Brig. Gen. Augustine Warner Robins. Robins AFB, one of the largest Air Force bases in the South, is a source of both pride and industry for the city.

The city also boasts a parks and recreation department, a civic center, one of the largest aviation museums in the United States (Museum of Aviation), shopping, festivals and a community theater.

Many different styles of housing can be found in Warner Robins. Median rent is \$878, and selected monthly owner costs of housing units with a mortgage are \$1,121. Mean travel time to work for those living in Warner Robins is a little over 20 minutes.

PLANNING YOUR MOVE

Relocating to a new home can be one of the most stressful situations in life. Whether moving across town or the nation, preparation and organization make all the difference.

Regardless of which method you choose, the first step should be to inventory your personal belongings. The list, with photographs of any valuables, will be important for both insurance purposes and to help keep you organized during transit.

Plan for one full day to pack each room though the kitchen and garage may take longer. Make a rough estimate of your packing schedule and then add 50 percent more time. It always takes longer than predicted to pack. Toss or donate unused items to lighten your load. Visit www.goodwill.org, www.salvationarmyusa.org or www.clothingdonations.org for locations near you or to arrange a pickup.

BUYING VERSUS RENTING

The decision to buy or rent is the most important step in your relocation process. Purchasing a home entails a long-term financial and emotional commitment with various pluses and minuses. Advantages include the possibility of building equity and the freedom to design and decorate your property or landscape. And don't forget the tax benefits. Disadvantages include upkeep, property taxes and fluctuating property values.

Renting, on the other hand, makes moving easier and someone else maintains the property. Amenities such as laundry rooms, exercise rooms, swimming pools and tennis courts vary from one rental complex to another. The main disadvantage is a loss of control over the residence. Some complexes, for example, restrict or prohibit pets and personal touches such as painting. And the landlord or property managers can also raise the rent with proper notice.

To determine your best choice, account for all your needs, review your financial situation and research your options thoroughly.

FINDING AN APARTMENT

Be prepared when you meet with the leasing agent, property manager or owner. Bring a list of what you are looking for in a rental; it is important to be clear about your needs and to get all your questions answered. You will also need to provide information and verification about your job, your income and your past rental history. Dress to make a good impression and treat the meeting like a job interview — be polite and arrive on time.

Use a written checklist with the landlord to document the condition of the rental before you move in, and keep a copy of the completed checklist to use when you move out.

Employment & Economy

in Houston County

AFTER AN 1821 TREATY between the state of Georgia and the Creek Indians, land lottery winners began moving into newly minted Houston County that same year, claiming tracts for about 7 cents an acre and starting to plow the fertile, sandy loam for corn, wheat, potatoes and other fresh vegetables. The county took its name from Gov. John Houstoun, one of the original Sons of Liberty of the American Revolution. And though over the years the spelling has been slimmed to "Houston," it's still pronounced the way he did: "HOW-ston."

Rail and Transit Access

Georgia's first railroad tracks were laid in the mid-1830s on routes leading from Athens, Augusta, Macon and Savannah. Some 25 years later, the state not only could claim more rail miles than any other in the Deep South but also had linked its major towns and created a new rail center in Atlanta. In the early 1900s, a tiny train made its way into Houston County. Its first stop, named Wellston in honor of William H. Wells, the chief engineer of the Georgia Southern and Florida Railroad, was built on land that is now known as Robins Air Force Base and Middle Georgia Regional Airport. After that, the railroads continued to expand until the 1920s, when a long decline began that lasted into the 1990s. Today, the state's rail system is a strong, 5,000-mile network anchored by two major lines, Norfolk Southern and CSX, and a couple dozen short lines.

Natural Resources

By the 1880s, Houston County had become the largest peach-growing county in the United States, according to the Georgia Department of Agriculture. The county's rural roots are celebrated to this day at public venues like the Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter in Perry, the county seat, and smaller private enterprises such as nurseries, roadside produce stands, farmers markets and garden clubs.

These days, though, agriculture is far overshadowed by manufacturing and Robins Air Force Base, Georgia's largest single industrial complex with approximately 23,000 workers, an annual \$1.45 billion federal payroll and a \$3.15 billion contribution to the Georgia economy in fiscal 2018, a \$273 million increase over fiscal 2017.

Abundant labor and easy transportation have drawn other industries over the years, but the two biggest boosts to the economy were the Army's 1941 selection of level cotton fields near the railroad stop of Wellston for a depot, named Robins Field in memory of Brig. Gen. Augustine Warner Robins, onetime spy and the Air Force's "Father of Logistics," and the decision to run Interstate 75 north-south through the county under the direction of another hero general, then-President Dwight D. Eisenhower, "Father of the Interstate Highway System."

Amid World War II and security demands extending into the 21st century, Robins Field evolved into Robins Air Force Base, home of the Air Force Materiel Command's Warner Robins Air Logistics Complex, worldwide manager of aircraft, engines, missiles, software and avionics and accessories — and the engine for much of middle Georgia's economic growth.





And growth has boomed. The U.S. Census estimated that in 2018 more than 155,000 people lived in Houston County in its three largest towns — Warner Robins, Perry and Centerville — plus its unincorporated communities and rural areas. Nearly 90 percent of residents over 25 held at least a high school diploma, and about a quarter had attained a bachelor's degree or higher. More than 17,000 veterans called "Georgia's Most Progressive County" home. Per capita personal income was \$25,289, and the median household income was \$55,965, higher than the state's \$52,977 the census said.

According to the Houston County Development Authority, other target industries that drive the region's economy include aerospace, advanced manufacturing, food processing, distribution, and logistics and agribusiness.

Robins Air Force Base

Nearly 25 percent of the jobs in Houston County are at Robins Air Force Base. The approximately 23,000 people who work there — including military, civil service and private contractors — make the base the largest employer in Georgia. Robins Air Force Base is estimated to have an annual economic impact of almost \$3.15 billion in the state of Georgia, according to the 2018 Robins Air Force Base Economic Impact Statement.

JOB-SEEKER TIPS

Always keep your resume up-to-date and have several versions that target specific industries and highlight your skills that fit their job descriptions.

Compile several reference lists with a good variety of people and former business associates. Be sure to first ask each if you can use them as references.

Compose a comprehensive, catchy and succinct cover letter of no more than a page (this is no place to ramble). It will introduce you and your desire to work for the company. Have a knowledgeable friend check it for errors; misspelled words and bad grammar hint at carelessness and indifference. Know what the company does, and highlight skills, work experience and education that apply to the position.

Maintain a positive, professional and broadbased presence on social media such as Facebook and LinkedIn; almost all employers search social media sites to vet job candidates, and your absence there will raise red flags. Also be aware that images and comments posted spur-of-the-moment can be searched out forever and come back to haunt you.

Be prepared for an interview at any time. When you submit your application, a supervisor may want to talk immediately, or the phone may ring with a call from a hiring director. Compose — and rehearse — your one-minute self-promotional speech on who you are, an achievement or two and your strengths. It's not vanity to make a good first impression. If a supervisor wants to know why she should hire you, be ready.

Always follow up with thank-you letters and calls. Even today, a letter, as well as the quick-response email, will separate you from a surprising number of the other applicants — to your advantage — and keep your name fresh in the interviewer's mind. Judicious calls display your continued interest. Writing out beforehand what you want to say helps. So does rehearsal.

Be aware that due to the usually huge numbers of applicants, most companies follow up only with candidates in whom they are interested. Don't take it personally if you are not notified that you did not get the job.

PETS

Moves are stressful for everyone - including the family pet. Pets can sense stress and a change in routine can be difficult for them. If possible, keep your pets in a quiet, secure area while movers pack up or unload your belongings. Movers will have your door open while they move boxes and furniture, and a pet may slip out the door undetected. Make sure you keep a collar with an ID tag on your pet at all times. Ensure the tag has your current phone number on it. It is also a good idea to microchip your pets. Remember to keep the microchip's contact information up-to-date. If your pet escapes during any part of your move, you want the animal shelter that scans the chip to be able to contact you.

Your pet may face many outside dangers in Georgia, such as alligators, armadillos, bats, bears, beavers, coyotes, rats, raccoons, foxes and more. Keep your dog on a short leash in wooded areas, especially if it starts sniffing or pawing the ground. Avoid allowing your dog to walk around or swim in unknown waters.

The area also is home to parasites, including fleas, ticks and ear mites. Outdoor pets can

bring these pests into the home, posing a risk to humans since they can transmit disease through their bites. Limiting and supervising your pet's outdoor activities can help it avoid these dangers.

Education & Academics

in Houston County

FINDING THE RIGHT SCHOOL and educational opportunities for each family member is an important part of any move. This chapter outlines Houston County's public schools system, private schools, charter schools and home schooling criteria, as well as local libraries and higher education institutions. To be enrolled in Georgia school, a child must be at least 5 years old by Sept. 1 of the school year. Those wishing to register their child in school should bring the following to the school office: a birth certificate or other proof of the child's age, and the child's previous school records and immunization records. For more details on Georgia's minimum vaccine requirements for students in grades K-12, visit Georgia Department of Education's website at www.gadoe.org.

In 2010, Georgia, along with the majority of other states, the District of Columbia, Guam, American Samoa, the Northern Mariana Islands, the U.S. Virgin Islands and the Department of Defense Education Activity, adopted Common Core State Standards that provide a consistent set of educational expectations for students regardless of ZIP code. When a family moves, a student's education is often disrupted because the student may be forced to repeat material or learn at a different level at the new school. With common standards across states, this disruption will be reduced — of particular interest to military families. At present, national Common Core State Standards exist only for English language arts and mathematics though Georgia has state standards across the full curriculum. Choosing a School

Choosing the right school is very important, so be sure to research each one before deciding. Contact the school by phone or by visiting its website, which is a valuable source to learn about a school district's statistics and curriculum. Talk to people in the area, especially friends and colleagues who already live there. If the school shows promise, schedule a visit and bring a list of written questions about student-teacher ratios, computer availability, extracurricular activities, sports programs, music programs, gifted programs and grading standards.

Discuss the potential school with your child: what they liked and what they didn't like. Your family's ability to readily adapt to a move and to find happiness in your new home may depend, in part, on how happy your children are in their new school.

CHARTER SCHOOLS
