

WELCOME

n behalf of the men and women of the 439th Airlift Wing, welcome to Westover Air Reserve Base, Massachusetts, home to the largest air reserve base in the Department of Defense and the military's largest transport jet. Here at Westover, our mission is to provide global-reach capabilities with mission-ready Citizen Airmen.

Our Airmen answer the nation's call by consistently delivering aircrews, cargo and passengers in support of overseas contingency operations and peacetime missions both in the United States and abroad.

LOCAL TRAFFIC CONDITIONS

New England has traffic islands called rotaries. The traffic in the rotary has the right of way over traffic entering it. There are rotaries off base at each of the two main exits to Westover. Seat belt use is mandatory for drivers and all passengers in vehicles both on and off the installation. Hands-free cell phone use for drivers is strictly enforced at Westover. Federal employees shall not engage in text messaging when driving a GOV or when driving a POV while on official government business. Additionally, headphones while running or walking on roadways is prohibited. The base speed limit is 30 mph unless otherwise posted. Off base, the speed limit on the interstate highway is 65 mph.

FLIGHT LINE SAFETY

Restricted areas of the flight line are clearly marked by red lines. You must use entry control points (ECPs) while entering and exiting the flight line. Base entry points are located on the base map that is provided in the welcome package. Practice a See and Be Seen Policy. Reflective belts must be worn on the flight line during periods of decreased visibility and at night on unlit ramps. We operate on a 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. schedule with an occasionally high tempo of operations. Flight line speed limit is 15 mph.

MEDICAL INFORMATION AND SICK CALL

The 439th Aerospace Medicine Squadron is an outpatient clinic only. Hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The squadron does not have an emergency room, urgent care or after-hours clinic. Ambulance response is activated by calling 911, 24/7. Airmen needing to speak with a flight surgeon may contact the flight surgeon at 413-386-3022 (cell). Emergency room care is available at the Baystate Medical Center at 759 Chestnut St. in Springfield, 413-794-0000, or Holyoke Medical Center at 575 Beech St. in Holyoke, 413-534-2500.

Connecticut Area: Take Route 91 North to Route 291 in Springfield to Fuller Road. Take Westover ARB exit off Fuller Road.


Vermont and Points North: Take Route 91 South to Mass. Turnpike. Head east to Exit 5 in Chicopee. Follow signs to Westover ARB.

HISTORY

WESTOVER ARB

Westover Air Reserve Base was initially constructed under a war-readiness appropriation measure signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1935. Inaugurated on April 6, 1940 and completed by June 1941, the then U.S. Army Air Forces Westover Field was intended to provide protection to the Northeast Air District against air and sea attacks.

Named in honor of Maj. Gen. Oscar Westover (1883-1938), late U.S. Army Air Corps Chief of Staff, the facility saw increased roles during World War II (1939-1945). In it, U.S. Army Air Forces personnel hosted bomber and anti-submarine forces, provided troop and supply transportation services, operated a classified bombsight installation facility, and trained fighter pilots and airborne engineers. The installation also became a detention point for prisoners of war. The effective fulfillment of said responsibilities placed Westover Field among the most important U.S. military bases during the war.

After the war, the installation became an U.S. Air Transport Service's port of entry for African, Asian, and European shipments. Upon its transfer to the newly created U.S. Air Force and under a number of threats taking place through the Cold War (1947-1991), Westover Air Force Base sustained an active role in all major U.S. military operations. During the Berlin Airlift Operation (1948-1949), its units worked non-stop with allies for almost a year shipping food, coal, oil, and other supplies to German citizens isolated by a Soviet blockade. Korean War (1950-1953) mission needs were met through its personnel transportation services, also used to bring back

casualties for medical treatment. Air intelligence images taken with U-2 planes were developed in secure facilities and B-52 bombers and troops were sent to Vietnam during the entire conflict. This important Strategic Air Command base began operations under the U.S. Air Force Reserve Command in 1974 and became instrumental in providing humanitarian assistance to Europe, Central America, and South America.

Westover Air Reserve Base became an important troop and supply transportation site during operations like Desert Storm (1991), Restore Hope (1993), and Uphold Democracy (1995) besides providing disaster relief assistance in Florida, Pakistan, and Louisiana. After the terrorist attacks to the World Trade Center and The Pentagon (2001), the base continuously participated in the same military roles through Operation Enduring Freedom (2001-2014) and later efforts. Recently, installation personnel were deployed to various domestic locations to provide medical assistance to COVID-19 Pandemic victims.





Major General OSCAR WESTOVER (1883-1938)



Maj. Gen. Oscar Westover rose from the rank of private to the heights of leadership during the early days of military aviation. A signal officer with a taste for flight, Westover became one of a handful of U.S. Army officers qualified to fly air balloons, dirigibles, and airplanes. Upon becoming Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army Air Corps, he promoted the sustainment of military aviation during the Great Depression (1929-1939) and the use of strategic air power before his untimely death in an airplane crash.

General CURTIS LEMAY



Gen. Curtis LeMay was assigned here during World War II, and he had direct involvement in the base's dramatic enlargement in 1955 into a huge SAC base. The famous Air Force leader, who quickly rose through the ranks to four stars and command of SAC — one of the most powerful military organizations in the world — was assigned to Westover as a lieutenant colonel in 1941. He shipped out of Massachusetts for duty in World War II in early 1942. He left his post as SAC commander in 1957 to become the Air Force vice chief of staff. In 1961, President John F. Kennedy appointed him as the Air Force chief of staff. Gen. LeMay retired in 1965.

HISTORICAL MILESTONES

THE '40S

September 1941: Work is completed on Building 1520, a combined fire and police station, constructed on Hangar Avenue near the Base Hangar. Feb. 1, 1948: Westover becomes a Military Air Transport Service (MATS) base.

THE '50S

April 1, 1955: The Strategic Air Command (SAC) takes control of Westover AFB.

April 1, 1955: The 4050th Air Refueling Wing becomes the host unit of Westover as SAC takes over the base from the Military Air Transport Service (MATS).

Spring 1957: The 337th Fighter Interceptor Squadron, an Air Defense Command tenant unit at Westover AFB, switches from the F-86D to the F-86L Sabre.

Sept. 24, 1958: Capt. William H. Howell, 99th Air Refueling Squadron, captures a world weightlifting record flying a Westover KC-135A Stratotanker, airlifting a 78,089-pound payload more than 1 mile into the air.

THE '60S

Jan. 9, 1961: The 347th Bombardment Squadron — one of three B-52 flying units of the 99th Bomb Wing — is reassigned to McCoy AFB, Florida, leaving the 346th and 348th Bombardment Squadrons at Westover.

April 1962: SAC establishes an auxiliary airborne command post at Westover. This was a Boeing EC-135 packed with communications equipment similar to the Looking Glass aircraft.

Nov. 10, 1965: The last KC-97 tanker leaves Westover for the "boneyard" at Davis-Monthan AFB, Arizona.

April 1, 1966: The Air Force Reserve's 905th Military Airlift Group, flying C-119 Flying Boxcars, eventually converts to C-124C Globemaster II transports. The unit moves to Westover from Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks, Connecticut.

THE '70S

March 31, 1970: Eighth Air Force headquarters concludes operations, ending almost 15 years at Westover.

Sept. 15, 1972: The 4713th Defense Systems Evaluation Squadron, with its EB-57 Canberras, begins operations at Westover.

July 12, 1973: The 590th Air Force Band performs its farewell concert. Among the first active-duty Air Force units to leave the base following the Air Force's announcement of the partial closure of Westover, the band left on Aug. 24 for McGuire AFB, New Jersey.

May 19, 1974: Westover becomes the nation's first Air Force Reserve base.

THE '80S

August 1981: Westover hosts "Condor Redoubt," the most massive Air Force Reserve exercise ever held. More than 3,000 reservists and 200 aircraft participate in the two-week training mission.

May 1987: The Air Force officially decides to assign 16 Air Force Reserve C-5A transports to Westover. The aircraft began arriving in October.

September 1988: A Westover C-5 aircrew airlifts firefighters and equipment for battling fires into Yellowstone National Park.

THE '90S

Aug. 22, 1990: Twenty days after Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein ordered his troops to invade neighboring Kuwait, the Air Force activates Westover's 337th Military Airlift Squadron.

Feb. 5, 1991: Over 100 members of the 74th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron depart for Desert Storm duty overseas. This is the first time since Vietnam that a Westover reserve unit has deployed.

August 1992: Westover C-5s ferry supplies, vehicles and personnel to Homestead AFB, Florida, to assist in the relief efforts following Hurricane Andrew.

August 1995: The 337th Airlift Squadron begins the first of more than a dozen missions to support Operation Joint Endeavor in Bosnia.





MISSION

he 439th Airlift Wing is the premier unit-equipped reserve team hosting joint partners; we are leaders in providing global reach to achieve national objectives.

The 439th Airlift Wing is capable of providing worldwide air movement of troops, supplies, equipment and medical patients. Strategically postured on almost 2,500 acres in western Massachusetts, Westover is the nation's largest Air Force Reserve base. It is the closest fully operational military base to Europe, providing world-class support to military aircraft and people going to and returning from missions overseas. Support units provide communications, engineering, logistical, medical and security requirements. The peacetime mission includes recruiting, training and supervision of personnel to ensure mission readiness. The wing is also responsible for the management of aircraft maintenance and all assigned Air Force combat support real property, equipment and supplies.

C-5 GALAXY

The 439th Airlift Wing maintains and flies eight C-5M Super Galaxy cargo aircraft. The Lockheed C-5M is one of the world's largest transport aircraft. The C-5 first arrived at Westover in October 1987. C-5s are the largest aircraft in the Air Force and specialize in missions involving outsized and oversized cargo that no other aircraft can carry. The C-5s are capable of carrying 270,000 pounds of cargo. The C-5 cargo compartment can hold six Greyhound buses. It can also hold two U.S. Army M-1 battle tanks that weigh 60 tons each. At nearly 143 feet, the length of the C-5 cargo floor is longer than the distance of the Wright brothers' first flight.

AIR FORCE RESERVE UNITS

The 439th Airlift Wing is a subordinate unit of Headquarters, 4th Air Force. It is organized under the objective wing structure with group commanders for operations, maintenance and mission support. The wing consists of headquarters staff, three groups, 16 squadrons and one flight. The wing is authorized for about 2,600 personnel — 11 percent officers and 89 percent enlisted with a support staff of about 700 civilians. These figures include about 400 Air Reserve Technicians who manage reserve issues between unit training assemblies. Westover also has more than 70 active guard/reserves assigned to support our security forces, maintenance and EOD specialties.

The 439th Operations Group is composed of three squadrons and one flight. The units under this group include the 439th Operations Support Squadron, 337th Airlift Squadron, 439th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron, and the 439th Contingency Response Flight.

The 439th Maintenance Group is composed of two squadrons. The units that fall under this group include the 439th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and the 439th Maintenance Squadron.

The 439th Mission Support Group is composed of seven squadrons and one flight. The group includes the 439th Force Support Squadron, 439th Civil Engineer Squadron, 439th Communications Squadron, 439th Logistics Readiness Squadron, 439th Security Forces Squadron, 42nd Aerial Port Squadron, 58th Aerial Port Squadron and 439th Contracting Flight.

The wing also has the 439th Aerospace Medicine Squadron and 439th Aeromedical Staging Squadron assigned.



TENANTS

estover's 28 tenant units include more than 2,000 military and civilians representing all four branches of the U.S. military. In addition, the base houses a Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS), which annually brings thousands of young men and women into the U.S. military. Other tenants include a contracted off-base military housing office, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Defense Contract Management Agency.

MILITARY ENTRANCE PROCESSING STATION

In July 2003, the Springfield Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS) moved into its newly constructed facility at Westover. The MEPS relocated from the Springfield Federal Building, 1550 Main St., in downtown Springfield, Massachusetts, a place it had occupied since the building opened in 1982.

The MEPS is one of a network of 65 MEPS located nationwide and in Puerto Rico.

A separate Department of Defense agency, USMEPCOM is composed of two geographical sectors and staffed with personnel from all military services.

The mission of USMEPCOM and the Springfield MEPS is to process individuals for enlistment or induction into the armed services, based on DOD-approved peacetime and mobilization standards.

MARINE CORPS RESERVE TRAINING CENTER

The unit's mission is to provide the means to process immediate air support requests, coordinate aircraft employment with other supporting arms, manage terminal control assets supporting ground combat and combat service support forces, and control assigned aircraft and itinerant manned and unmanned

aircraft transiting through its area of responsibility.

ARMY 302D MANEUVER ENHANCEMENT BRIGADE

The 302D Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, Patriots, as described by U.S. Army doctrine, is a "unique, multifunctional, mission command headquarters that is organized to perform support area operations for the echelons that it supports." A Military Police Battalion, Engineer Battalion, Chemical Battalion and a Brigade Support Battalion are organic subordinate commands that comprise the 302D MEB. This organization, doctrin-

ally, "is designed to provide mission command of forces from multiple branches but especially those that conduct support area and maneuver support operations for the force." The 302D MEB employs subordinate commands in support of "Army divisions, echelons above divisions, joint, interagency or multinational headquarters." Distinctively, it is one of the few terrain owners in the U.S. Army's arsenal, which, according to doctrine, "makes the 302D MEB the best organization in the U.S. Army to perform support area operations for divisions and corps."

FITNESS CENTER

Marked outdoor walking/running trails begin at the fitness center and wind through the base running trail down Parameter Road. Outdoor activities such as tennis can be played on 2 courts. FamCamp is located in conjunction with Outdoor Recreation Activity and offers 20 sites with a concrete pad, 50-amp and 30-amp electrical service and water to each site. It also offers a pull-through dumping station, bath house and laundry room.

The mission of the Pioneer Valley USO is to enhance the quality of life for the men, women and families of the armed forces through social, recreational, educational and entertainment programs and services. The Conference Center is centrally located on Westover with ample parking.

A 10-by-14-foot screen is provided with portable audiovisual capability available. The Stonina Room offers seating for up to 150 participants by a combination of gallery seats and fixed theater-style seats. This area boasts state-of-the-art audiovisual capabilities, including computer data display for PowerPoint, DVD, VCR and overhead projection.

A moveable partition can be opened into the

Stonina Room to accommodate larger groups. The Halvorsen Room offers an executive-style meeting space for 10 people. Video teleconferencing is offered in the Halvorsen Room.

The Conference Center has Wi-Fi to provide access to outside email accounts. At the Base Chapel across the street, there are two additional breakout areas. The first area provides a U-shaped arrangement for up to 25 and the second area for up to 30. The center also has a reception spot that can be used as a centrally located refreshment area.

The Westover Conference Center is complemented by an on-site manager, available to accommodate guests' needs Monday through Friday. Signature services include arrangements for program planning, overnight accommodations, hospitality transportation, catering needs and desired support requirements.
